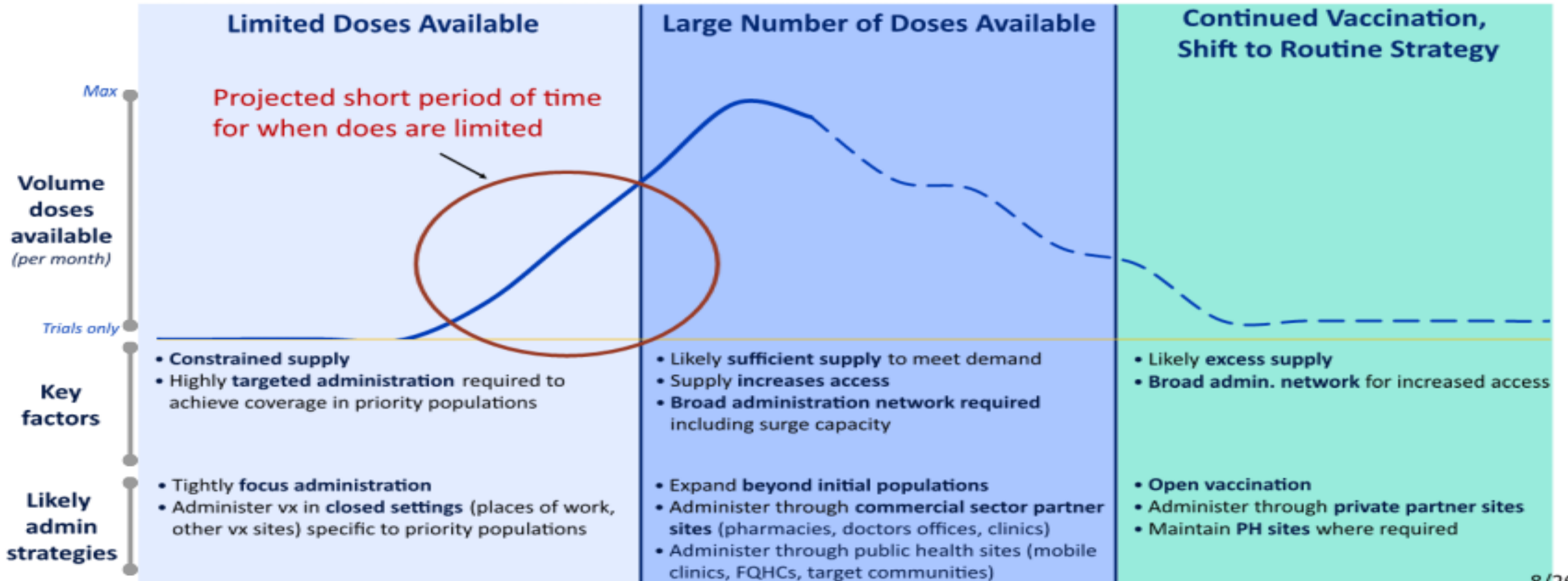

COVID-19 Vaccine Texas Overall Summary

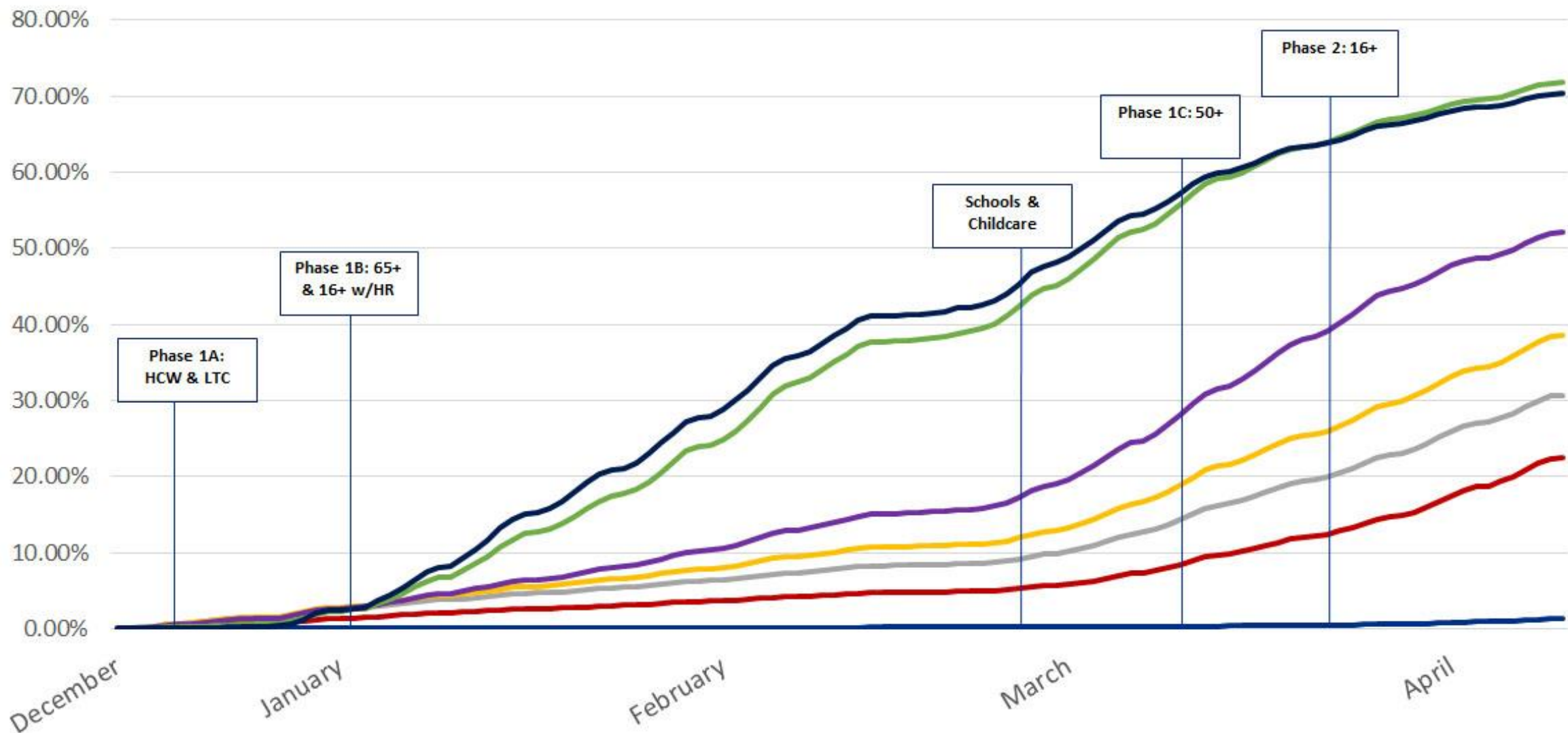

Percent People Vaccinated by Age Group by Vaccination Date

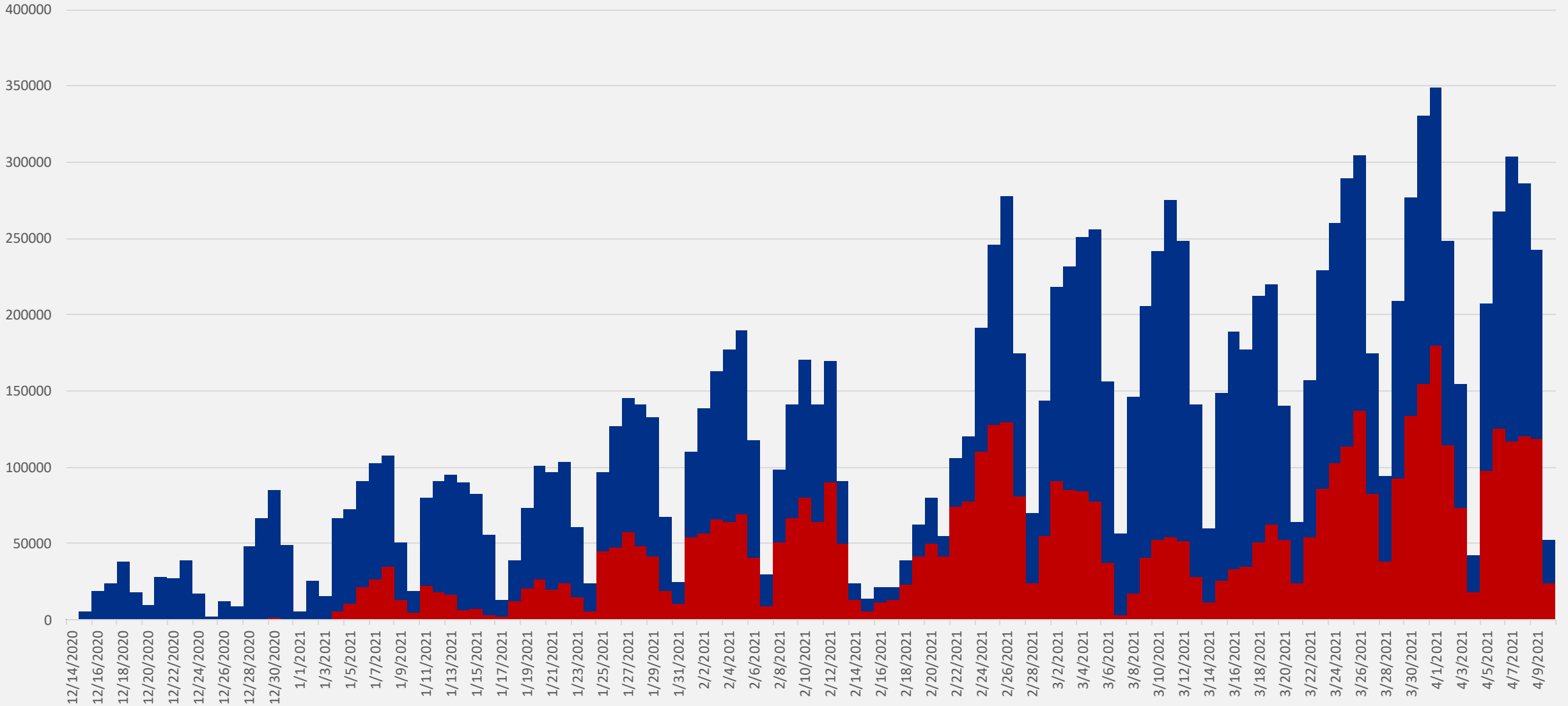

Doses Administered by Date and Dose Number

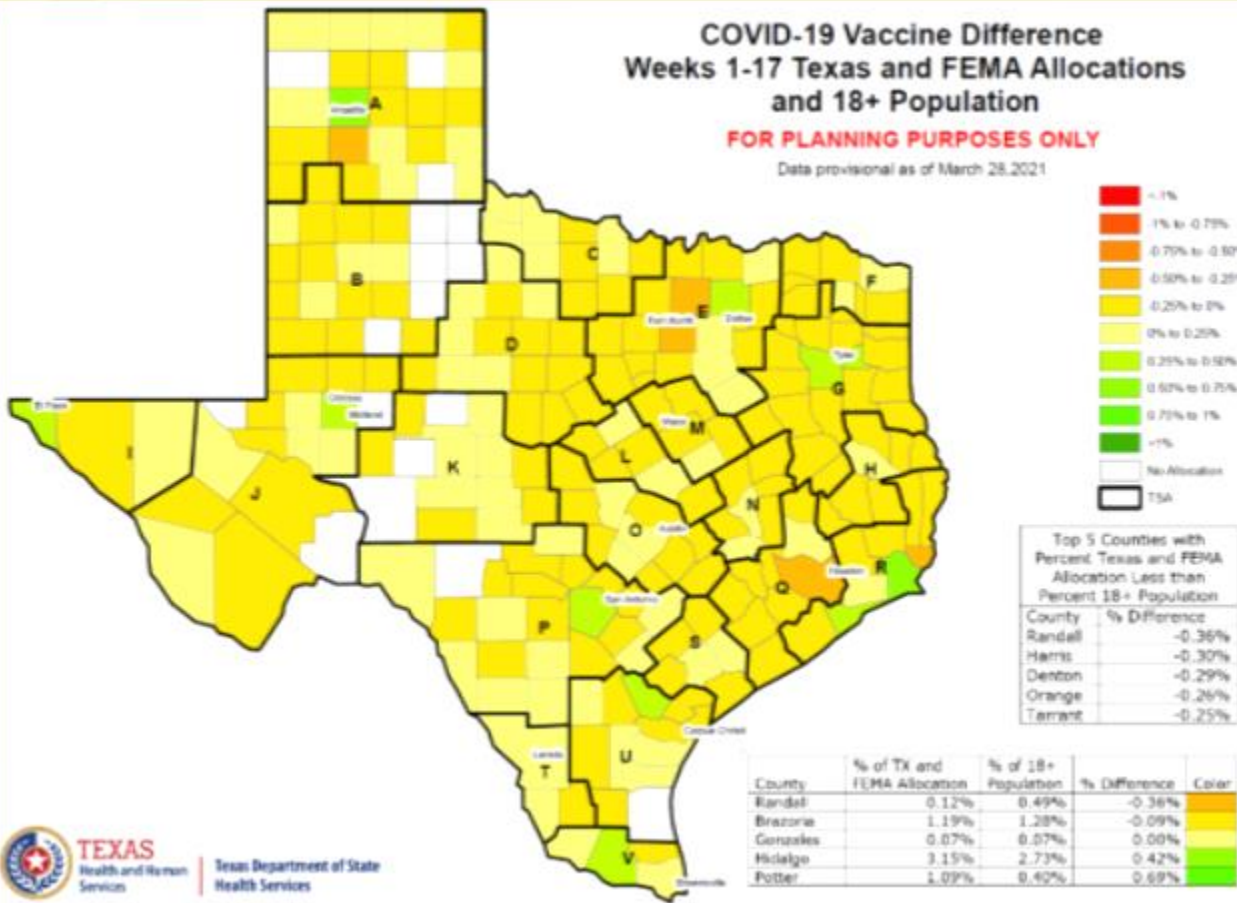

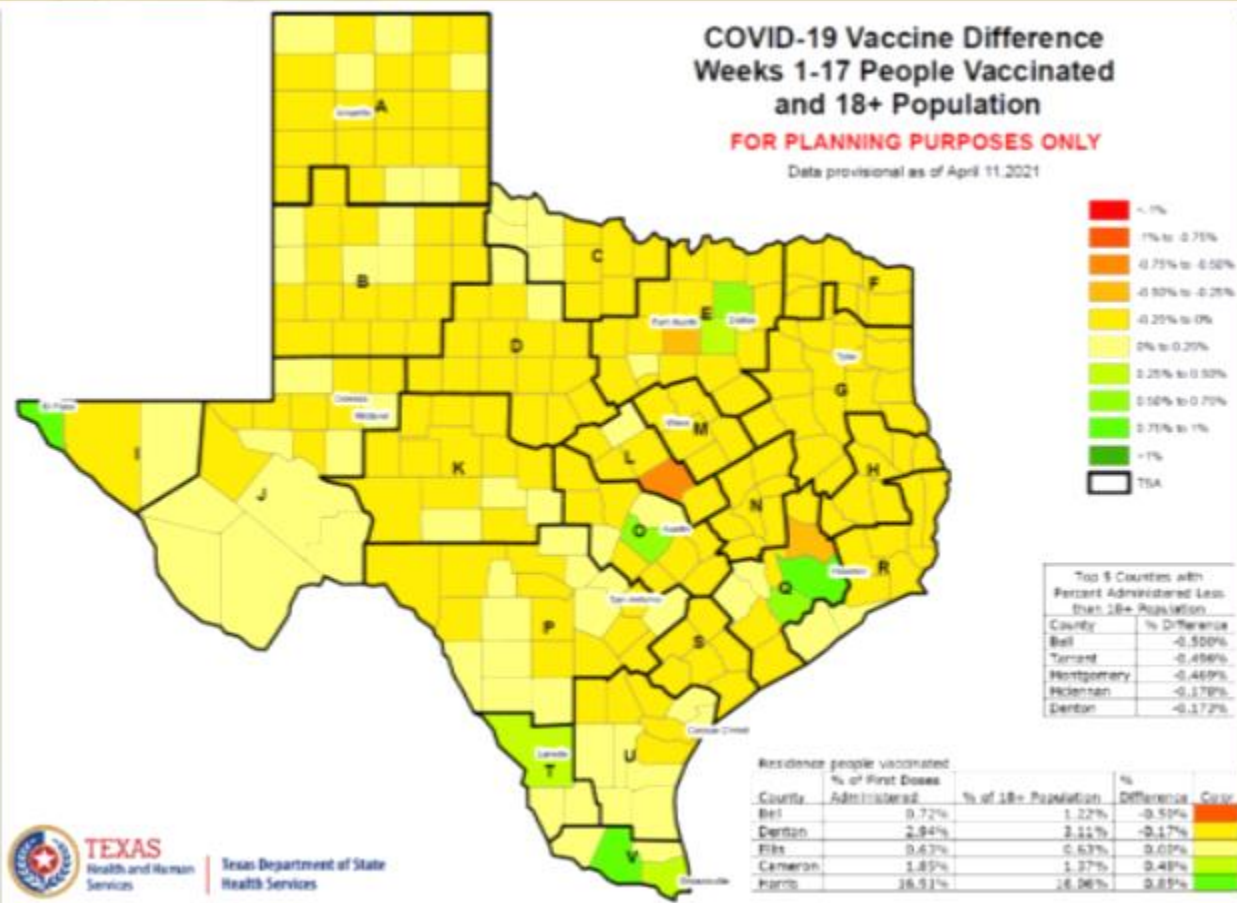

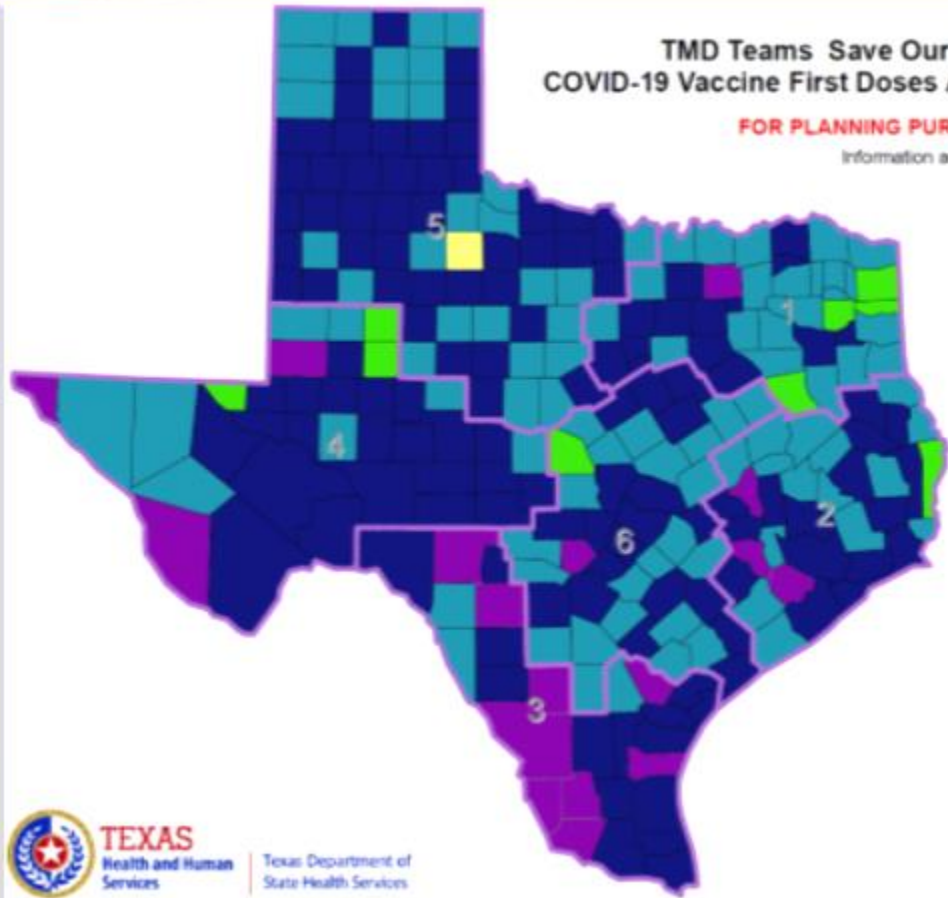

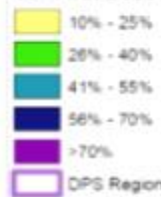
TMD Teams Save Our Seniors COVID-19 Vaccine First Doses Administered 65+

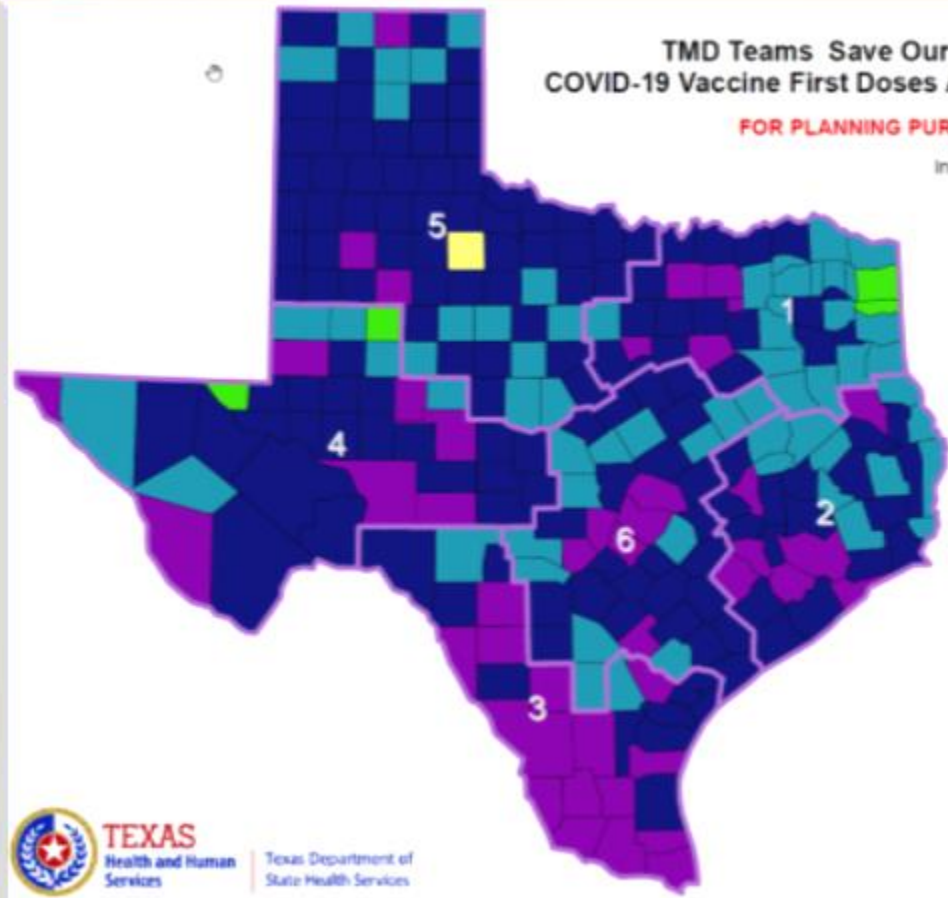
65+ First Dose

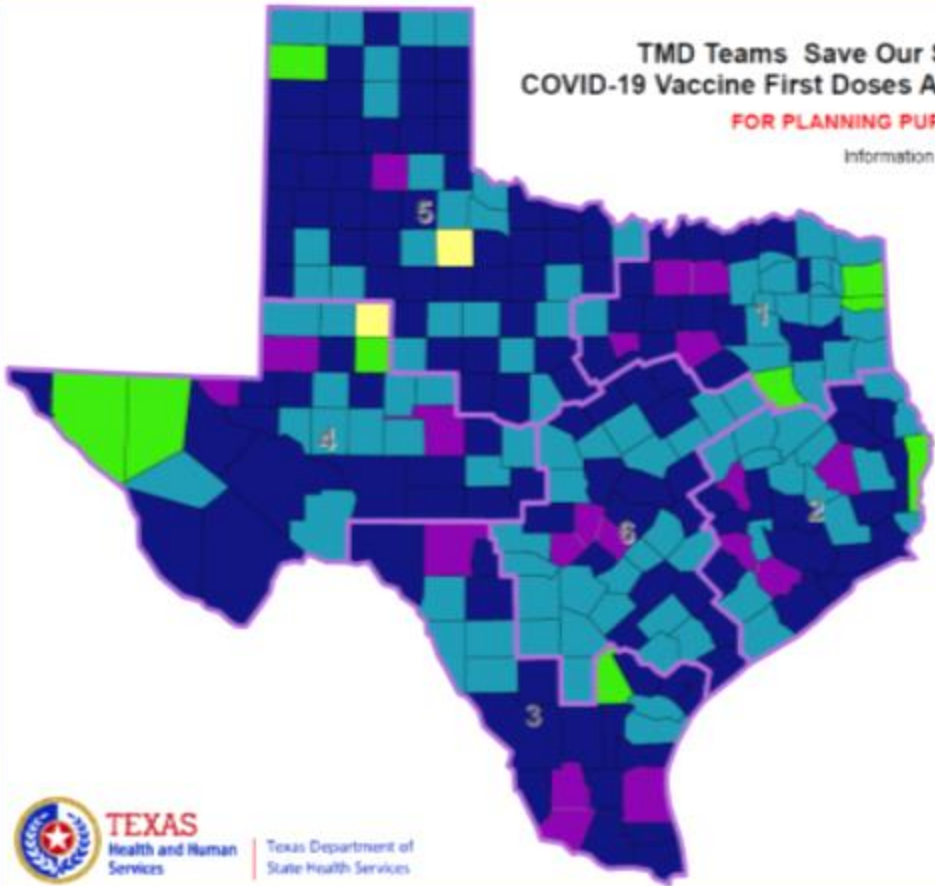

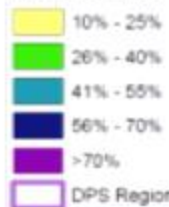

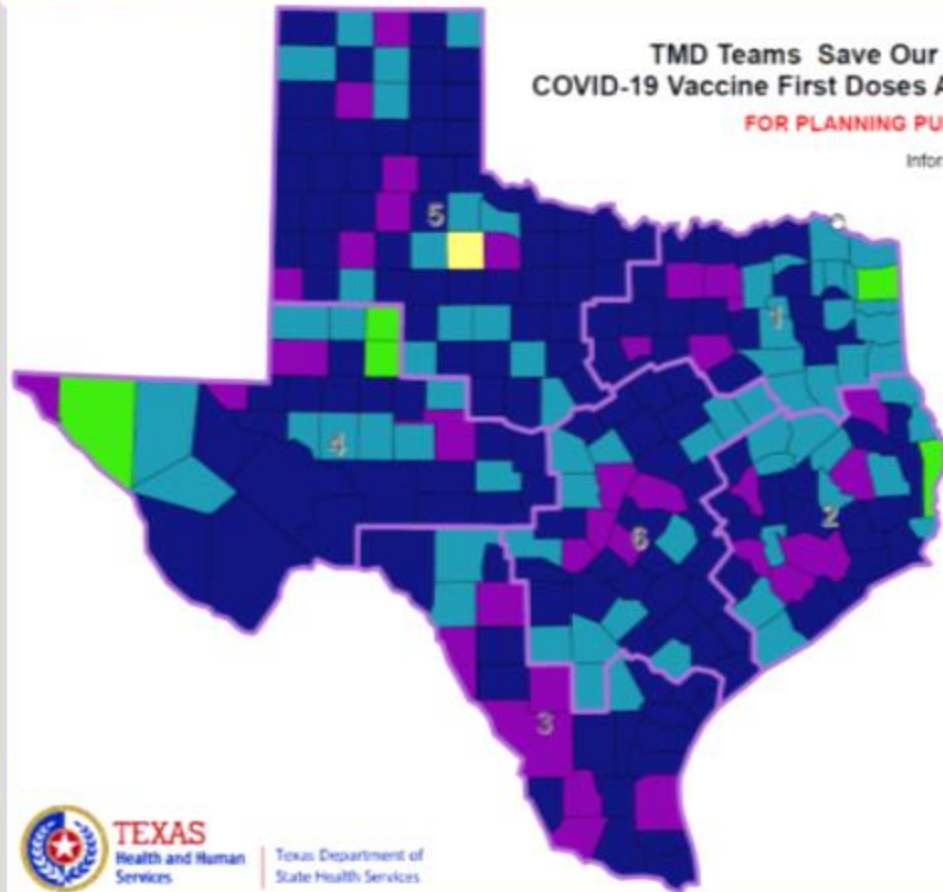

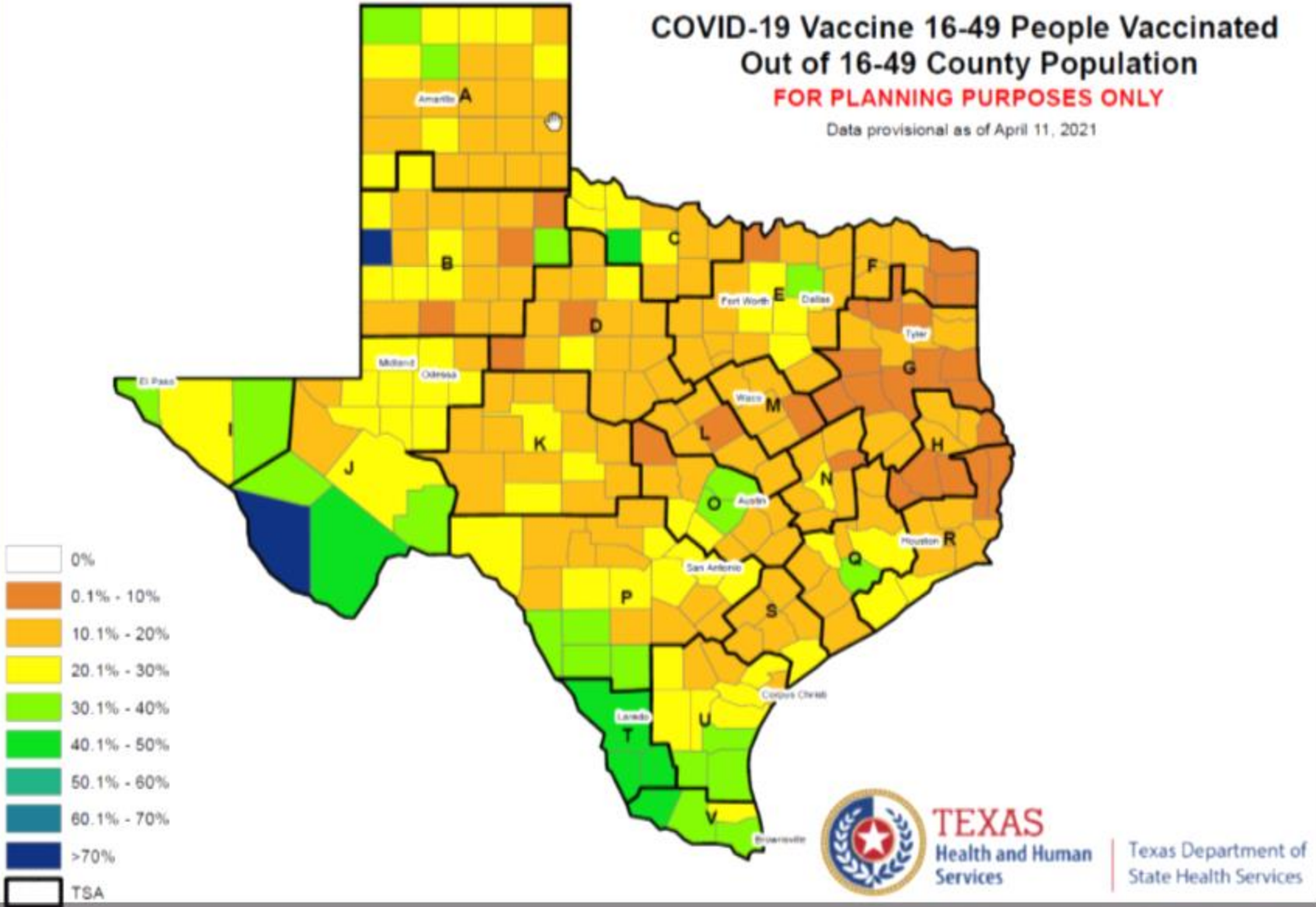

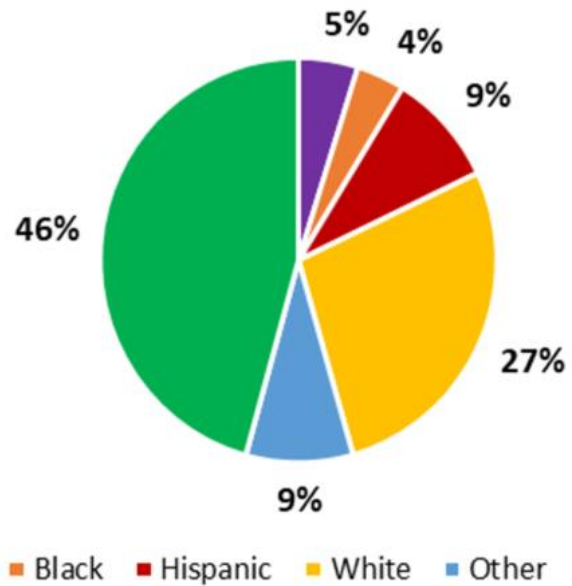
Mandatory Race/Ethnicity Reporting Effective February 4th



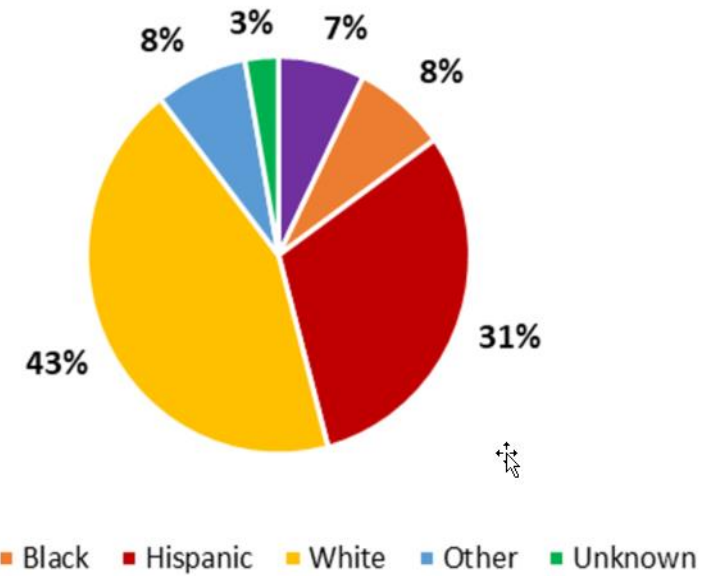

12/14 - 2/3 First Doses Reported Administered by Race/Ethnicity

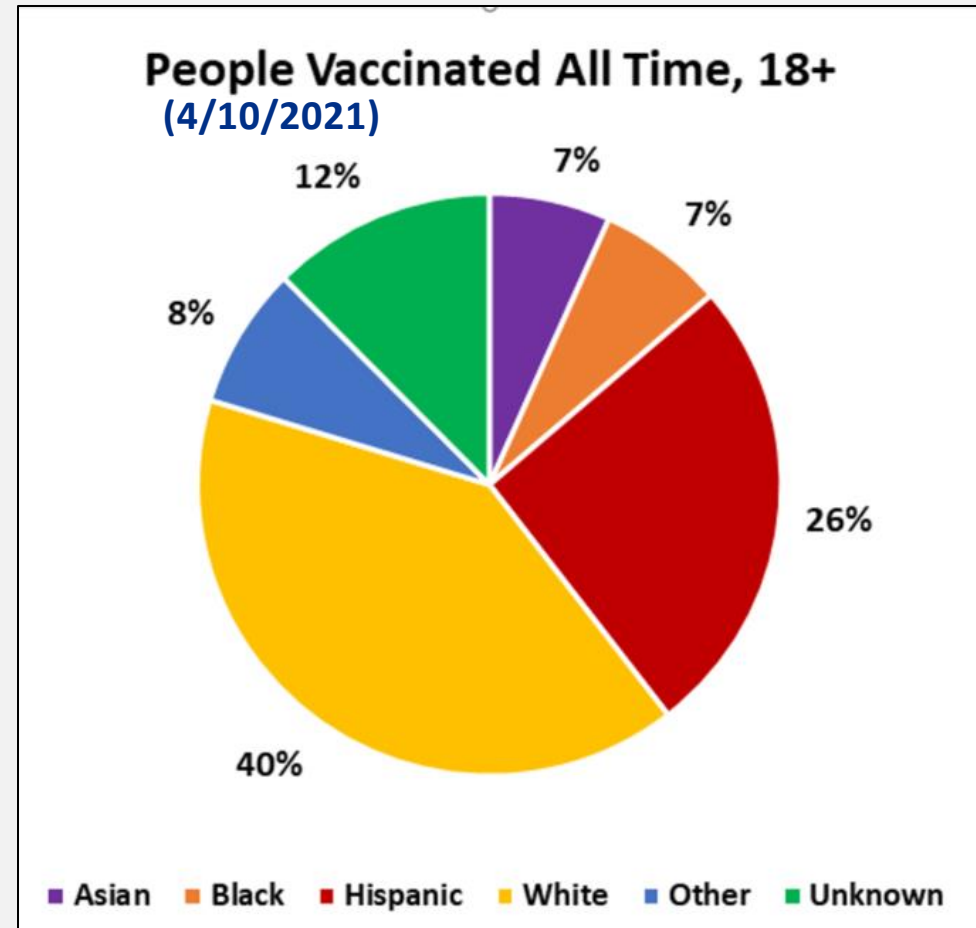
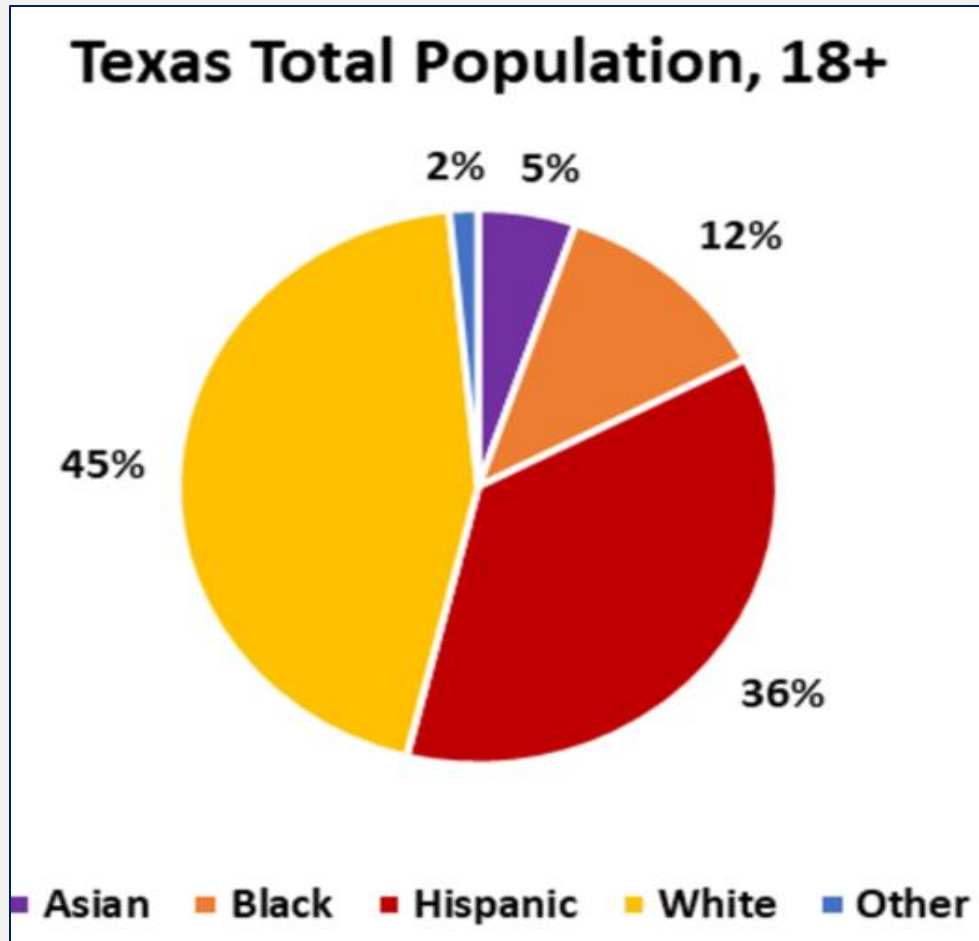

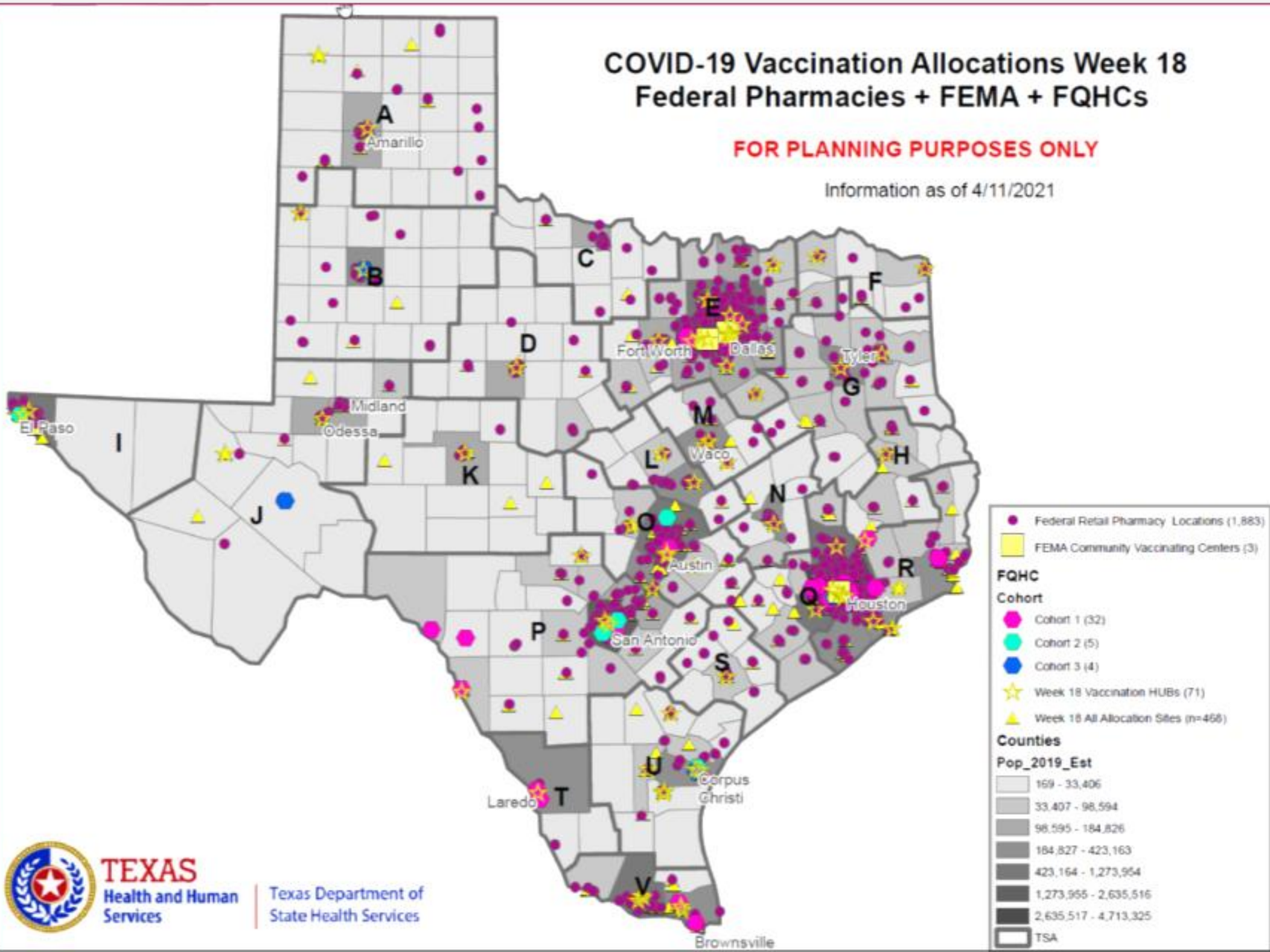
