
Psychiatric Hospitals

Number of Psychiatric Hospitals, January 2009*

- 30.9% decrease between 1999 and 2004
- 13.2% increase between 2004 and 2009

Note: During this period (1999 and 2009), there was a 14.8% increase in the number of acute care hospitals

Psychiatric Hospitals, Texas, 1999-2009*




Psychiatric Hospital Beds, January 2009*

- 5,424 psychiatric beds in the state.
 - 14% of the hospitals (n=6) had fewer than 50 hospital beds.
 - Average number of beds per hospital was 126.
 - 49.4% were public beds, 15.5% were nonprofit beds, and 35.1% were for-profit beds.

Psychiatric Hospitals by Location, January 2009*

- 88% of 43 psychiatric hospitals were in metropolitan areas.
- Of the 38 metropolitan area hospitals, 57.9% were for-profit, 26.3% were nonprofit, and 15.8% were public hospitals.
- Of the 5 non-metropolitan area hospitals, 80% (n=4) were public, 20% (n=1) were for-profit, and there were no nonprofit hospitals.
- Metropolitan hospitals operated 74.7% of the 5,424 beds in the state; non-metropolitan area facilities operated the remaining 25.3%.
- Two hundred and twenty-nine (230) counties did not have a psychiatric hospital.
- Harris county had the most number of psychiatric hospitals (n=8) followed by Bexar county (n=3), Travis (n=4), and Dallas (n=3).
