
Psychiatric Hospitals

Number of Psychiatric Hospitals, January 2010*

- In 2005, there were 38 psychiatric care hospitals in Texas and 40 in 2000, a decrease of 5.0%.
- In 2005, there were 38 psychiatric care hospitals in Texas and 43 in 2010; a 13.2% increase.

Note: During this period (2000 and 2010), there was a 16.4% increase in the number of acute care hospitals.

In 2003 there were only 36 psychiatric hospitals in the state.


Psychiatric Hospital Beds, January 2010*

- 5,450 psychiatric beds in the state.
 - 12% of the hospitals (n=5) had fewer than 50 hospital beds.
 - Average number of beds per hospital was 127
 - 48.7%(2,653) were public beds, 15.4%(842) were nonprofit beds, and 35.9%(1,955) were for-profit beds.

Average number of beds according to hospital type and location:



Psychiatric Hospitals by Location, January 2010*

- 88% of 38 psychiatric hospitals were in metropolitan areas.
- Of the 38 metropolitan area hospitals, 57.9% (22) were for-profit, 26.3% (10) were nonprofit, and 15.8% (6) were public hospitals.
- Of the 5 non-metropolitan area hospitals, 80% (n=4) were public, 20% (n=1) were for-profit, and there were no nonprofit hospitals.
- Metropolitan hospitals operated 75.2% of the 5,450 beds in the state; non-metropolitan area facilities operated the remaining 24.8%.
- Two hundred and twenty-seven (227) counties did not have a psychiatric hospital.
- Harris county had the most number of psychiatric hospitals (n=8) followed by Bexar county (n=3), Travis (n=4), and Dallas (n=3).
