Scope of Chemical Dependency Treatment Benefits

Clinical Screening	A brief informational process in which basic information is obtained to determine if a potential chemical dependency problem exists and a chemical dependency assessment or treatment may be warranted
Clinical Assessment	Clinical process of obtaining and evaluating historical, social, functional, psychiatric, developmental, substance use or other information from the Enrollee and family to determine treatment needs
Hospital Inpatient Services (Medicaid enrollees only)	Medically necessary services ordinarily furnished by a Medicaid general acute hospital under the direction of a physician. Includes DRGs 433-438 (alcohol/drug dependence rehabilitation and detoxification)
Medically Monitored 24 Hour Residential Detoxification	Non-hospital residential service that provides a planned, structured, and organized physician-supervised detoxification program to treat individuals with a diagnosis of chemical dependency
Medically Monitored Outpatient Detoxification	An intensive outpatient program combined with a physician-supervised detoxification program.
24 Hour Residential Rehabilitation Program	Non-hospital residential service that provides a planned, structured and organized program to treat chemical dependency
Partial Hospitalization Rehabilitation Program	A planned, structured program that provides 20 or more hours per week of clinically intensive chemical dependency services

Intensive	A planned, structured program that provides 10 or more hours per week of
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Outpatient Rehabilitation Program	clinically intensive chemical dependency services
Outpatient Program	A planned, structured service that provides an average of 2 hours per week of chemical dependency counseling by a QCC
Outpatient Service	A service that provides at least one hour of chemical dependency counseling every two weeks by a QCC
Pharmacological Maintenance Therapy	A maintenance program for opiate dependent clients supervised by a physician following State and Federal regulations
Specialized Female Services	Traditional DSHS funded specialized services for pregnant and post-partum women and women with dependent children (inclusive of females in treatment who are attempting to regain custody of their children) that, in addition to gender-specific residential and outpatient chemical dependency treatment, include primary medical care for non-Medicaid females receiving treatment; other therapeutic interventions for females that may address issues of relationships, sexual and physical abuse and parenting; childcare while females are receiving services; therapeutic interventions for children with potential for substance abuse, and their issues of sexual and physical abuse and neglect; referrals for appropriate medical care for women and their children; and sufficient case management and transportation services to ensure that female clients and their children have access to the services described above
Dual Diagnosis Services	Integration of all levels of chemical dependency and mental health services for persons who have concurrent diagnoses which meet DSM-IV criteria for substance abuse or dependency and a major mental disorder
