
Region 8 Activities

- Educate the community about nutrition, healthy living and safety
- Serve as a resource for health care providers, infection control nurses at local hospitals and school nurses regarding disease reporting requirements, STD testing and treatment guidelines, and immunizations
- Recruit and educate Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) providers
- Distribute, install and inspect child passenger safety seats and teach parents how to use them correctly

Immunizations

- In 2014, the coverage rate for Texas for the recommended vaccination series dropped 8.5 points to 64%. Texas coverage rates are well below the national average of 71.6%. In the most recent data for Atascosa County, the coverage rate is 62.2%.
- The percent of public school students with a conscientious exemption from immunizations filed at the school district in Atascosa County is 0.3%, up from 0.18% in 2010.
