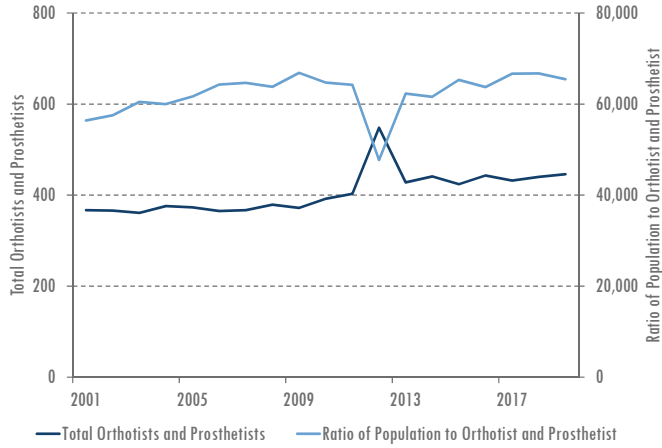




## Orthotists and Prosthetists

### Orthotist and Prosthetist Growth Trends



In 2019, there were 446 actively licensed orthotists and prosthetists providing care in Texas.

- This number represented a 1.1% increase since 2014 and a 19.9% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the orthotist and prosthetist workforce has improved by 2.1% over the past 10 years.

Despite these improvements, Texas still had fewer orthotists and prosthetists than the national average.

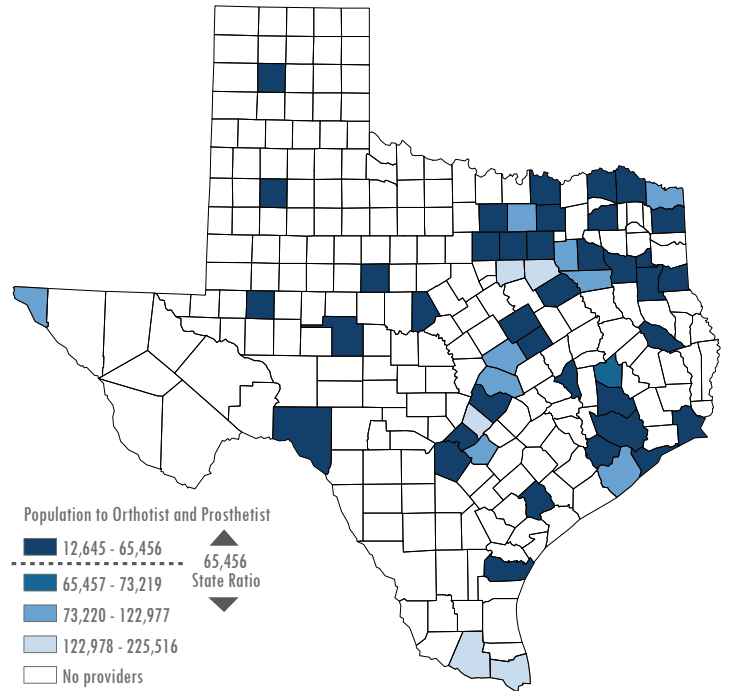
### Age Distribution of Orthotists and Prosthetists

Within 10 years, 44.2% of the current Texas orthotist and prosthetist workforce will be at or past retirement age.

- 9.9% of active orthotists and prosthetists in Texas were older than 65 years of age in 2019.
- 20.2% were between the ages of 56 and 65.

Orthotists and prosthetists were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 95.6% difference between the number of orthotists and prosthetists in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the percent difference was 73.5%.
