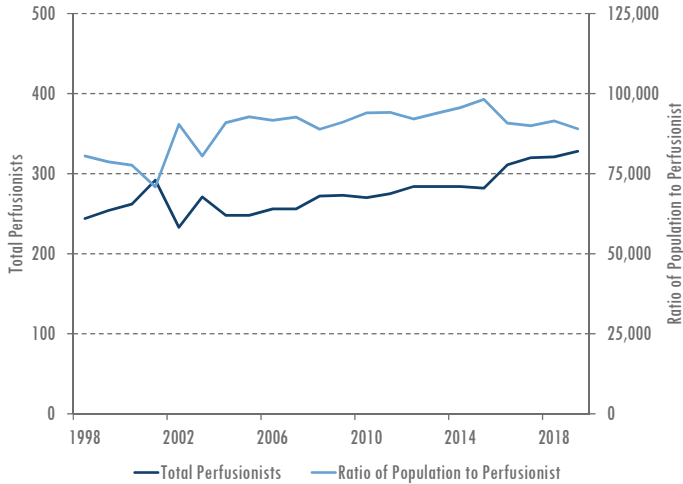

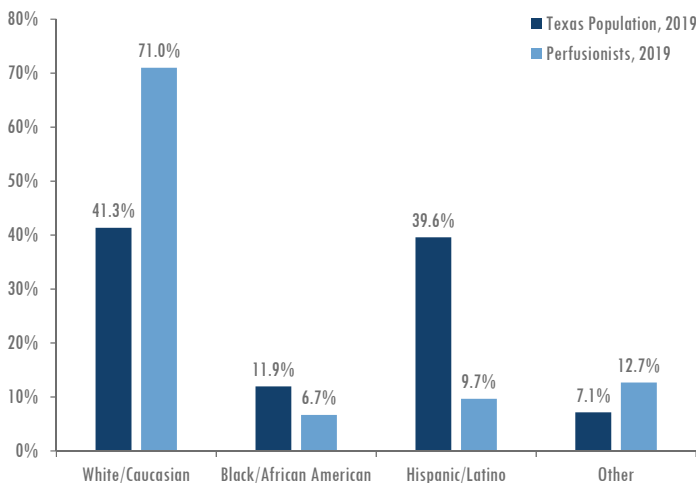
Perfusionist Growth Trends



In 2019, there were 328 actively licensed perfusionists providing care in Texas.

- This number represented a 15.5% increase since 2014 and a 20.1% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the perfusionist workforce has improved by 2.3% over the past 10 years.

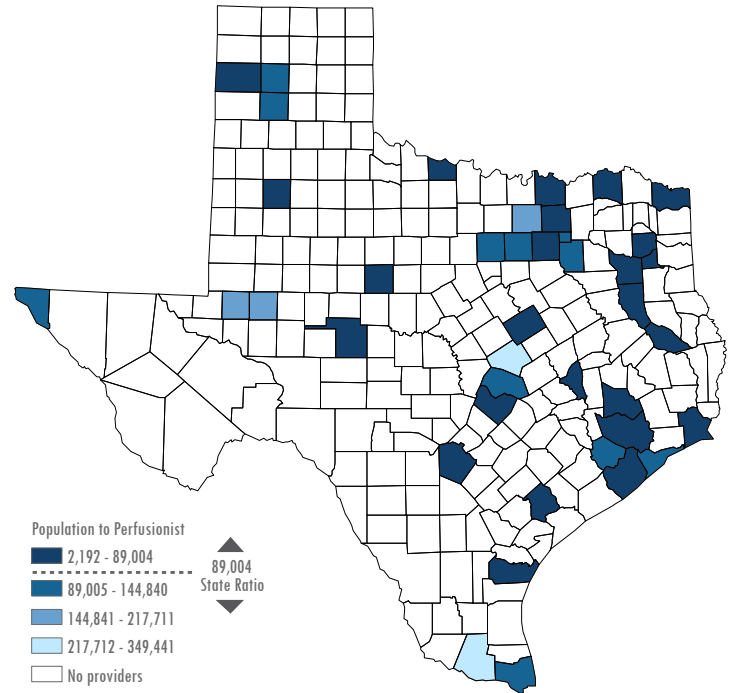
Race/Ethnicity of Perfusionists



Black/African American and Hispanic/Latino perfusionists were underrepresented when compared to the Texas population.¹

Perfusionists were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 162.4% difference between the number of perfusionists in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the percent difference was 88.5%.

Within 10 years, 30.8% of the current Texas perfusionist workforce will be eligible for retirement.

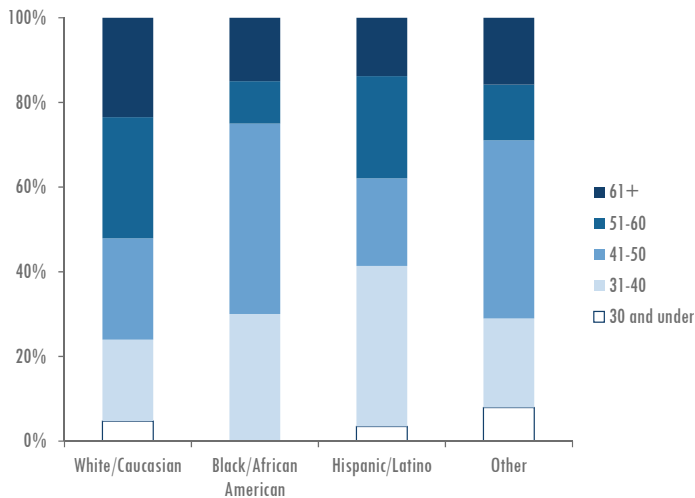
- 7.6% of active perfusionists in Texas were older than 65 years of age in 2019.
- 23.2% were between the ages of 56 and 65.

Age Distribution of Perfusionists by Race/Ethnicity



- Among white/Caucasian perfusionists, 52.1% were 51 years of age or older, while 23.9% were aged 40 years or younger.
- 45.0% of blacks/African Americans were between 41 and 50 years of age. Another 30.0% were between 31 and 40 years of age.
- 41.4% of Hispanics/Latinos were aged 40 years or younger, while 13.8% were 61 years of age or older.
