
Section 1: Access IAMOnline

Section 2: Sign in

Step 1: Enter Username

- Access the IAMOnline sign-in page.
- Sign in with your **“username”** (email).
- Enter your username in the text box and click the **“Next”** button.



Step 2: Enter Password


- The system will prompt you to enter the password associated with your username.


Step 3: Receive Code Via Short Message Services (SMS)

The system will prompt you to verify your account using the registered phone number entered during the account creation process. Click the **“Receive a code via SMS”**. The **SMS** option will send a text message to your phone.



General Information

The Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Registries (EMSTR) is made up of four registries – the EMS Registry; the acute Traumatic Injury Registry; the Traumatic Brain Injury Registry / Spinal Cord Injury Registry; and the Submersion Registry. EMSTR is a statewide passive surveillance system that collects reportable event data from EMS providers, hospitals, justices of the peace, medical examiners, and rehabilitation facilities. Texas is home to one of the largest EMS registries in the U.S. with more than four (4) million records submitted annually.
