


2014 Texas Selected Cancer Facts

The TCR is a statewide population-based registry that serves as the primary source of Texas cancer data. These data are used to measure the Texas cancer burden, progress in cancer prevention and control, and support a wide variety of cancer research.




Williamson County

In 2014, it is estimated that there will be 2,162 new cancer cases and 770 cancer deaths in Williamson County.


Average Annual Number of New Cancer Cases and Deaths, 5 Leading Sites, 2007–2011

The average annual number of all cancer cases in 2007-2011 was 1,446.


Mortality




The average annual number of all cancer deaths in 2007-2011 was 430.
