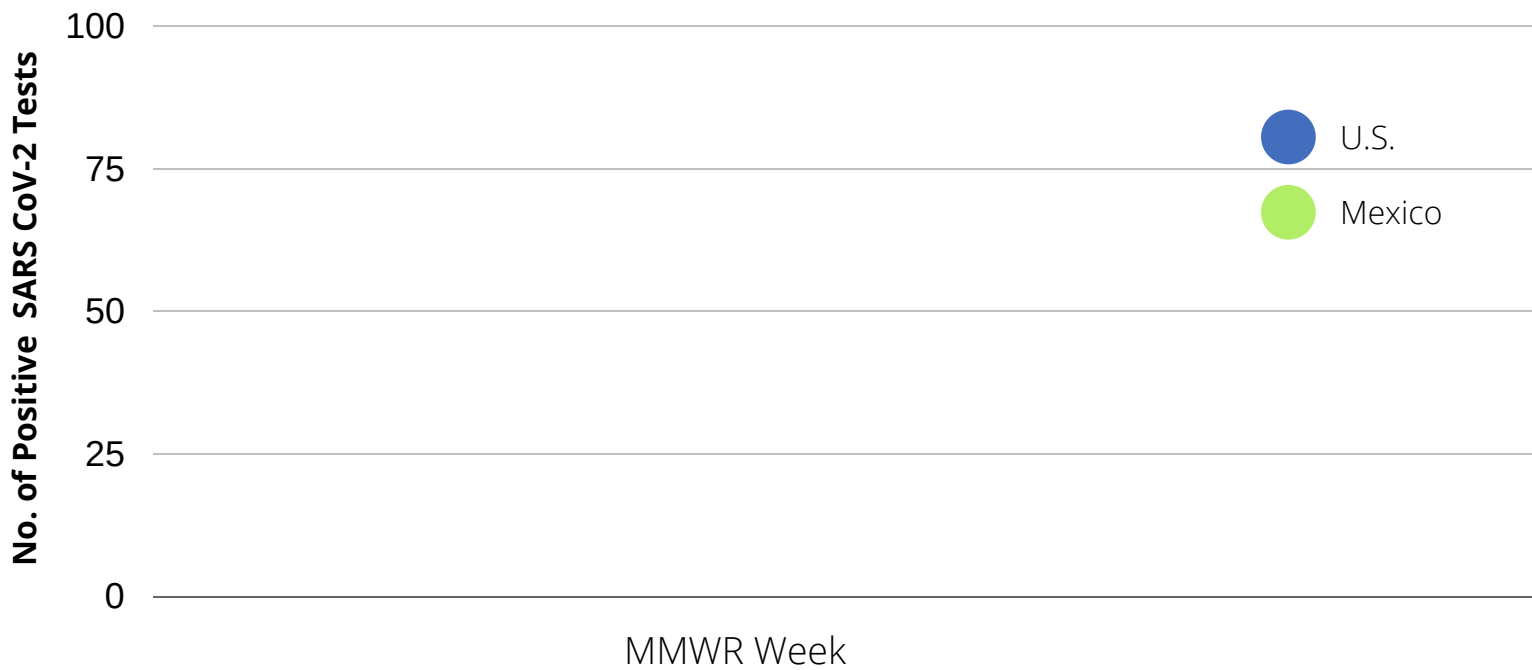

# U.S.-MEXICO BORDER INFLUENZA SURVEILLANCE NETWORK

## Laboratory Results



*ILI: Influenza-Like-Illness is defined as an acute respiratory infection with: measured fever of  $\geq 100$  F°; and cough; and/or sore throat with onset within the last 10 days.*

*CLI: COVID19-Like-Illness is defined as an acute respiratory infection with: measured fever of  $\geq 100$  F°; with at least TWO of the following symptoms: Chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, headache, difficulty breathing, body/muscle aches, nasal congestion, fatigue, runny nose; OR cough AND shortness of breath; OR recent loss of taste/smell; or clinical evidence of pneumonia; With onset within the last 5 days and NO alternative diagnosis.*
