Figure 1. Texas Counties Reporting any WNV Activity, Weeks 1-26

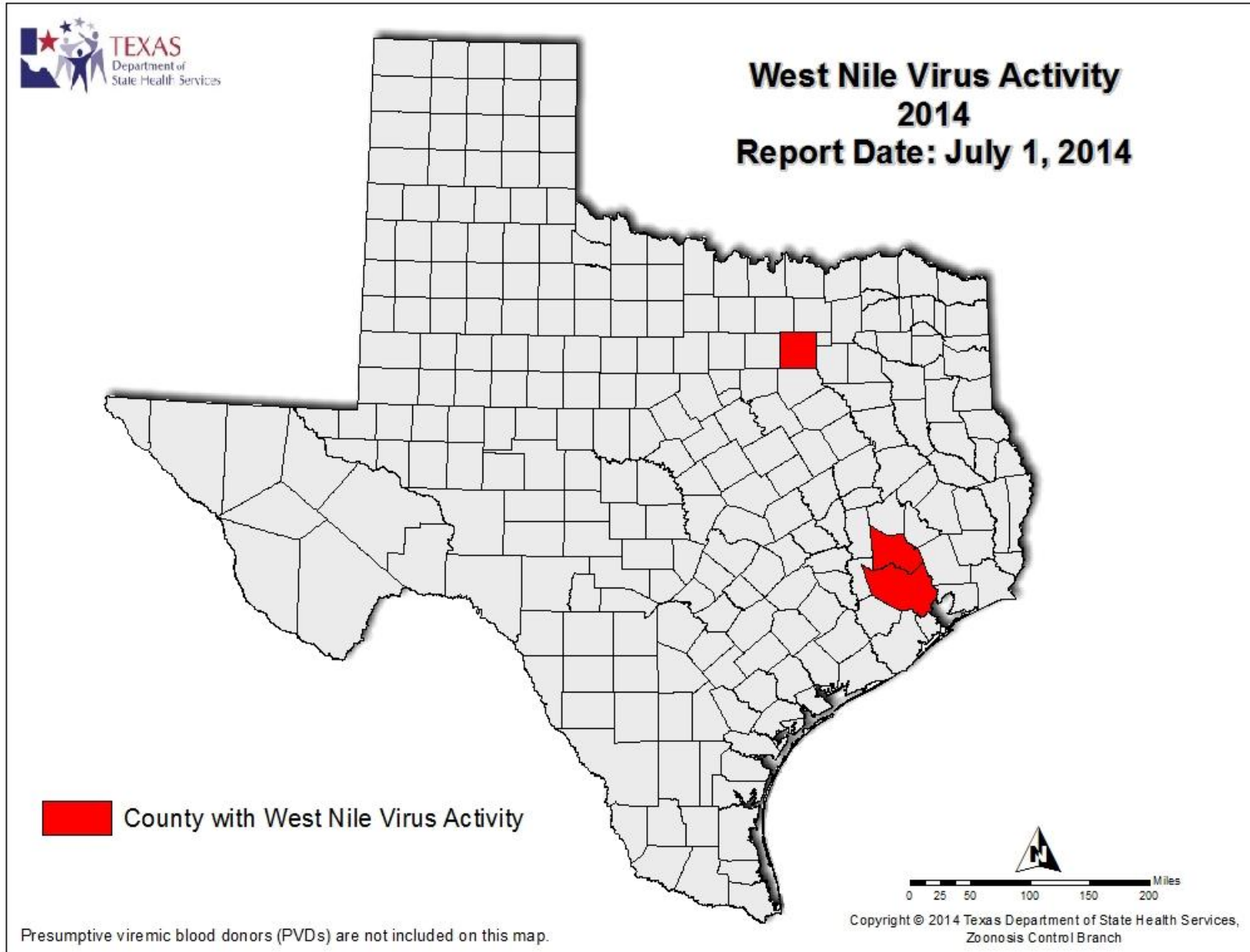
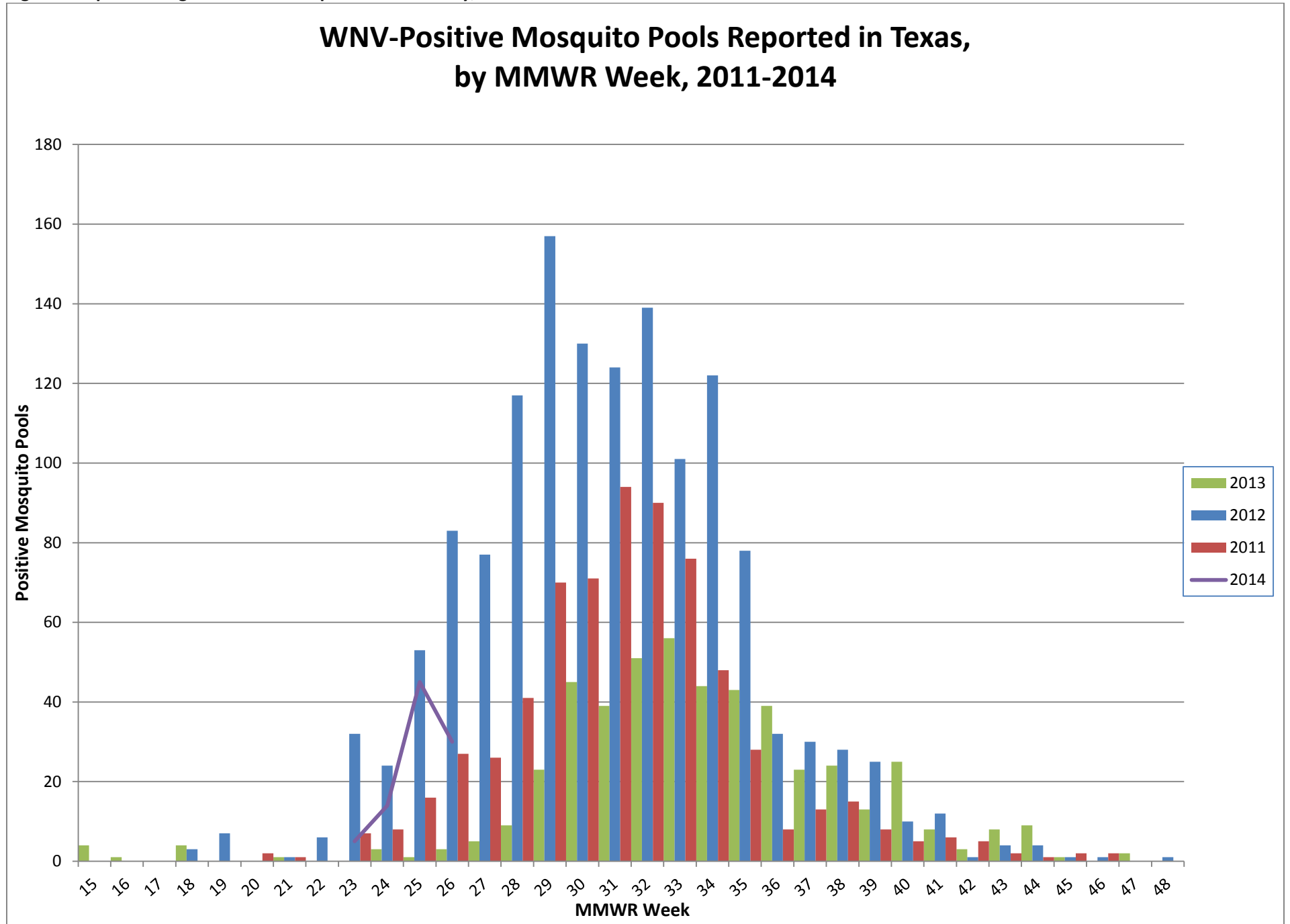


Figure 2. Epidemiologic Curve of Mosquito WNV Activity, 2011-2014
