ANNUAL SUMMARY OF MORBIDITY REPORTS FOR 1978

Morbidity totals published in this report represent the reporting year 1978, which is the sum of the 52 report weeks for the year. The standard report week is defined as Sunday through Saturday, and because "Week #1" of each year is the week containing January 4th, the actual period of time covered is from Week #1, ending January 6, 1978, through Week #52, ending December 30, 1978. The cumulative totals published for Week #52 of 1978 differ somewhat from the totals presented herein. The latter have been corrected by the removal of duplicate reports, the addition of delayed reports, and the making of other corrections.

The format used to display the 1978 Annual Summary data corresponds with that which was initiated for "Texas Morbidity This Week," Week #1, ending January 6, 1978. This format was designed to improve the readability and applicability for the prevention and control of communicable diseases in Texas.

Morbidity data collected and analyzed during 1978 can be compared to that of recent years because of the consistency of data management and reporting mechanisms and motivations. It should be recognized, however, that the noted changes in incidence of reported cases may be due in part to an increased emphasis or interest in the reporting of various diseases. Additionally, the completeness of reporting varies with disease. Rare occurrences of diseases, such as botulism, are more likely to be reported than commonly occurring diseases, such as salmonellosis. Because the reporting mechanisms and motivations seem to be consistent in recent years, the following analysis of trends is considered valid.

Current Trends in Reportable Diseases

Analysis of communicable disease morbidity data for 1978 reveals that the incidence of most reportable diseases continued in a pattern similar to that of recent years, with some notable exceptions. Percentage decreases in incidence rates are displayed in Table 1. Among the diseases listed in Table 1, the largest percentage decrease per 100,000 population (100%) was observed for diphtheria, paralytic poliomyelitis, Q fever, and relapsing fever. It is noted that no cases of the following diseases were reported to the Bureau of Communicable Disease Services during this period:

A notable statistic is the absence of reported diphtheria cases for the first time since records have been maintained (1920).

By contrast, percentage increases in incidence rates for other reportable diseases are recorded in Table II. Case reports received during 1978 for botulism exhibited a dramatic 200% increase in the incidence rate per 100,000 population. Leptospirosis and pertussis followed with increases of 120% and 74% respectively.

Preparations for a more comprehensive version of the Annual Summary for 1978 are currently underway. This additional publication will include various epidemiologic depictions of communicable disease activity which has occurred in recent years, as well as incidence rates and mortality data.
