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## Executive Summary

[The 2018-19 General Appropriations Act, S.B. 1, 85<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 \(Article II, Department of State Health Services, Rider 25\(e\)\)](#)

requires the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to annually review all fees under its authority. To meet this requirement, DSHS conducted a systematic review of all fee schedules, and also compiled a Fee Resource Manual, found in Appendix A.

DSHS collects fees when directed or authorized by Texas statute. These fees help support program operations and decrease demand on General Revenue appropriations. When setting fee levels, DSHS considers stakeholder input, budgetary needs, and the impact to businesses and public health. This fee review focuses on a few of the fee schedules authorized by statute:

- Drug Manufacturing and Distribution;
- Laboratory Fees; and
- Vital Statistics Fees.

# 1. Introduction

[The 2018-19 General Appropriations Act, S.B. 1, 85<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 \(Article II, Department of State Health Services, Rider 25\(e\)\)](#)

calls on the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to annually conduct a review of the fees under the agency's authority. DSHS is required to submit a report detailing this review to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor no later than January 1 of each year.

To address Rider 25(e) requirements, this report contains information about the follow up efforts by DSHS related to Drug Manufacturing and Distributing, Laboratory Fees, and Vital Statistics Fees. The report also includes a detailed review of specific fees under the Department's authority within three broad categories: consumer protection, laboratory and infectious disease services, and data and statistics. In addition to the analysis of individual fees of interest, the accompanying Fee Resource Manual in Appendix A contains information about DSHS fees, including associated revenue and costs.

## 2. Background

The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) mission is to improve the health, safety, and well-being of Texans through good stewardship of public resources, and a focus on core public health functions. To achieve this mission, the Department administers a variety of programs focused on promoting and protecting the health of people and their communities. For some DSHS programs, fees help maintain their ability to conduct public health functions.

Individual fee amounts are set through two mechanisms. Some fees, such as those related to certain Emergency Medical Service (EMS) licensing and regulation functions, are set in statute. Others, such as those established for laboratory testing, are set through the agency rulemaking process. Because of the broad-ranging impact of public health, DSHS must be mindful when establishing fee amounts that the fee does not become a deterrent to the protection of the public's health. On one hand, fee revenue reduces the demand on General Revenue appropriations to cover increasing costs. At the same time, a too-high fee could have unintended consequences that increase economic burdens on businesses or increase risk to the health and safety.

DSHS activities supported by fees can be divided into three broad categories: consumer protection, laboratory and infectious disease services, and data and statistics.

## 3. Consumer Protection

DSHS consumer protection programs ensure the public's health and safety by promoting and verifying compliance with certain standards by applicable entities and individuals. These standards, established or referenced through statute and rule, help maintain the safety and efficacy of services, goods, and facilities.

In pursuit of the DSHS public health mission and as authorized by the Texas Legislature, DSHS consumer protection programs collect a wide variety of fees. With certain statutory exceptions, DSHS consumer protection programs are generally mandated to cover the costs of operating the programs, including direct and indirect costs.

In the *Fee Schedule Report – FY 2017*, DSHS identified the Drug Manufacturing/Distributing Fee as an item requiring additional information to be included in the fiscal year 2018 report.

### Drug Manufacturing/Distributor Licenses

#### Overview

The Drug Manufacturing/Distributor program is included under DSHS food and drug safety responsibilities. The Food and Drug Safety function protects people in Texas from unnecessary morbidity and mortality through its standards for products that could pose a health danger if manufactured or used in an unsafe or neglectful manner. The program ensures facilities are using good manufacturing processes and have systems in place that assure proper design, monitoring, and control of manufacturing processes and facilities.

The Drug Manufacturing/Distributor program covers two specific license types: prescription drug and non-prescription drug. On average, DSHS conducts approximately 75 prescription drug manufacturer inspections each year. DSHS works to inspect prescription drug manufacturers at least every two years. In some instances, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) also registers and inspects these entities. There is an exception for facilities inspected by the FDA during that period to prevent duplication of effort.

In fiscal year 2018, DSHS reviewed the feasibility of adding to the current licensing structure, including an analysis of predicted financial impact to the current program and anticipated timeline for updating the tier structure rules.

## Feasibility Analysis

Drug Manufacturers and Distributors are subject to the same overall fee structure, with slight differences depending on whether the product is prescription or non-prescription. The Drug Distributor program covers both in-state and out-of-state entities that deliver or distribute drugs in Texas. The Drug Manufacturing program covers entities that manufacture drugs within Texas. Revenue from both programs is deposited in General Revenue Dedicated Account – Food and Drug Registration No. 5024. The combined prescription Drug Distributors and Manufacturers fee structure collects approximately \$3.0 million each fiscal year, or about 35 percent of the total fiscal year 2018 Fund 5024 amount of \$8.7 million.

DSHS licenses approximately 2,210 prescription drug manufacturers. Drug manufacturing licensing fees are biennial and are based on whether an entity manufactures or distributes prescription or non-prescription drugs. The initial and renewal fee structure has three tiers for license types. The current tiered fee structure is based on self-reported gross annual sales (see Table 1).

**Table 1. Current Fee Structure for Drug Manufacturing/Distribution Licenses.**

Gross Annual Drug Sales	
Tier 1	\$0 - \$199,999.99
Tier 2	\$200,000 - \$19,999,999.99
Tier 3	\$20,000,000 or more

Actual fees range from \$1,040 to \$2,295, depending on the type of product. Minor changes in filing status can incur additional, smaller fees if the change affects licensure enforcement.



While the current fee structure consists of three tiers, other DSHS consumer protection program fee structures include more tiers to ensure that the amount of fees assessed better align with the size of licensed entities.

Current Tier 2 gross annual sales range from \$200,000 to \$19,999,999.99 and require large and small business to pay the same fee. DSHS plans to propose as a rule change an alternative drug manufacturing fee structure with five tiers (see Table 2).

The gross annual sales and fee for Tier 1 will remain the same. DSHS will break the current Tier 2 in to three levels, leaving the fee and gross annual sale for Tier 5 the same (formerly Tier 3 in the current fee schedule).

Currently, 99 firms distribute/manufacture prescription drugs with gross annual sales between \$200,000 to \$19,999,999.99 and pay the same licensing fee (\$1,755) every two years. At the current Tier 2, the revenue amount is \$173,745. Once the new fee structure is in place, DSHS estimates that total revenue collected for the 99 firms under the three new tiers (formerly Tier 2) would be \$167,805, a reduction of \$5,940.

Additionally, there are 30 non-prescription drug firms that are currently in Tier 2 with total revenue collected of \$50,700. When that current tier is divided into

three new tiers, DSHS estimates that total revenue collected for the 30 firms would be \$46,800, a loss of \$3,900.

The revenue loss is not considered significant and should achieve the goal of ensuring smaller businesses are not paying a fee disproportionate to their amount of sales.

### **Timeline**

DSHS initiated the rulemaking process related to changing the fee structure in October 2018 and anticipates final adoption will occur in summer 2019. The target effective date is September 1, 2019.

## 4. Laboratory and Infectious Disease Services

The Texas Health and Safety Code allows DSHS to collect fees to recoup some costs for performing public health services, including laboratory testing and delivery of certain services to individuals necessary for protecting public health. Fee collection is not always feasible if there is no payor source. In those cases, DSHS depends on general revenue and federal funding sources to ensure that appropriate public health testing and infectious disease control efforts take place.

### Laboratory Fee Methodology and Rulemaking

A DSHS Laboratory budget workgroup has explored several options for updating laboratory fees, including: updating the current fee methodology based on operational costs; reviewing fee methodologies of other laboratories to determine whether similar methodologies could be implemented at DSHS; and using medical inflation rates to set fees.

The workgroup has also researched fee methodologies used by the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) as LCRA and DSHS perform similar tests on drinking water samples. DSHS is continuing to research the best approach for updating the fee methodology and this effort will continue into next biennium.

Additionally, DSHS has proposed rule changes to the Texas Administrative Code pertaining to laboratory fees. The purpose is to accurately reflect testing costs and allow more frequent updates to the fee schedule, while maintaining transparency. The proposed rule changes, which are currently in the rulemaking process, would improve notification of stakeholders and customers about upcoming fee changes and ensure an accurate fee schedule.

## 5. Data and Statistics

DSHS houses, maintains, and safeguards original records of important events in Texans' lives, including births, deaths, marriages, divorces, adoptions, and parentage changes. DSHS responds to customer requests for certified copies or verification of vital event records and other supplemental documents. DSHS produces documents that federal and state entities use to establish identity, citizenship, ownership, entitlement to benefits, and passport travel authorizations.

[Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 191](#), directs DSHS to operate as a self-funded program and allows fee collection for providing services to the public and performing other activities in connection with maintenance of the Vital Statistics system.

### Vital Statistics Fees

DSHS vital statistics operation costs have increased since fees were last raised.

- **Shipping:** DSHS is dependent on external organizations for shipping vital event certificates to consumers. Shipping services have increased standard and premium overnight shipping costs significantly since 2006.
- **Supplies:** Basic supplies used in order fulfillment are more expensive in terms of both unit price and volume required to respond to consumer demand. For instance, security paper, envelopes, consumable office supplies, printing, and workforce costs have increased.
- **Electronic Registration:** The Texas Electronic Vital Events Registrar system (TxEVER) will replace the current Texas Electronic Registration (TER) system.
- **Facility Security & Maintenance:** The DSHS Records building is nearing capacity without further action, and will require facility improvements to mitigate risks associated with security, fire controls, as well as provide for document preservation.

In *Fee Schedule Report – FY 2017*, DSHS identified increased demands on vital events record collection in recent years. The DSHS allocation of the 2006 fee increase covers higher costs for implementation of the new vital events system,

TxEVER. However, the current allocation structure does not account for long-term needs for a growing population or for ongoing maintenance of TxEVER.

Between fiscal year 2012 and fiscal year 2017, VSS experienced a 42 percent increase in the total volume of requests for service. Due to the increased demand, the DSHS budget for vital statistics may no longer be able to cover the cost to operate in the future. In 2017, DSHS discontinued overnight shipping of death certificates to funeral homes to reduce operating expenditures.

At the same time, a new electronic registration system was identified as a necessary technology to prevent fraud and reduce inefficiency. The result, the TxEVER system, will be fully implemented in fiscal year 2019.

### **Vital Statistics - Next Steps**

To address the long term needs of Vital Statistics, DSHS has requested funding from the legislature to ensure ongoing quality and security of vital events data in Texas, as well as improve customer service for Texans needing to access their records. This exceptional item addresses:

- long-term planning for the ongoing secure maintenance of Texas' vital records,
- immediate data security and quality measures to safeguard records,
- improving the quality and accuracy of death data, and
- increasing workforce capacity to keep up with the rising customer demand for vital records.

## **6. Conclusion**

DSHS collects a variety of fees to support programmatic activities and achieve the agency's public health goals. An in-depth review was conducted of specific fees within DSHS authority related to consumer protection, laboratory and infectious disease services, and data and statistics.
