Vaccine for 2011-2012

- No changes to current vaccine strains
 - A/California/7/2009 (H1N1)-like
 - A/Perth/16/2009 (H3N2)-like
 - B/Brisbane/60/2008-like (B/Victoria lineage)
- Fluzone high-dose
 - High-dose vaccine for 65+ years
 - 4 times the antigen of a regular flu shot
 - Study in progress to determine if high-dose vaccine provides greater protection

Laboratory

- Continue funding packaging and shipping related to flu surveillance ??
- Same VTM ordering process

- No changes in laboratory procedures at this time

Reporting

- Surveillance continues throughout the summer
 - "Scaled back"
- Influenza reportable by law
 - Novel influenza A cases in humans
 - Influenza-associated pediatric mortality
 - Outbreaks – LTCFs, jails, schools, camps, hospitals, etc.
- Voluntary influenza reporting
 - Pregnant/postpartum deaths
 - Discontinue May 22, 2011

Influenza Incidence Surveillance Project (IISP)

- Influenza and ILI surveillance
 - Outpatient illness by age group
 - Laboratory testing for multiple pathogens
- Providers contribute weekly reports and specimens
- Currently in 8 states
- Funded by CSTE
