# Follow-Up Activities for Enrolled TVFC Providers

The Immunization Quality Improvement for Providers (IQIP) Program initial site visits have been conducted on private providers enrolled in TVFC by TMF Health Quality Institute.Follow-up activities are required to be conducted at two, six, and 12 months by phone. Follow-up calls should last about 20–30 minutes.

#### TVFC Pediatric Influenza Orders for 2020-2021 Season

Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) Program providers may begin placing orders for the **2020-2021 influenza season** in **mid-January 2020**. The orders will be delivered starting in the fall of 2020.

Encourage providers to refer to their monthly TVFC Flu Dashboard to help assist them in planning for influenza vaccine ordering. It is not too late to continue to vaccinate patients with the current 2019-20 influenza vaccine. If providers need additional flu vaccine for the current season, they can do so by placing an order in EVI.



### **TVFC Flu Dashboard**

This season's TVFC flu dashboards will soon be distributed. The monthly flu dashboard allows providers to view their number of flu vaccine doses received and the number of flu doses administered to TVFC-eligible patients. In addition, the dashboard provides the number of pre-booked flu doses and each provider's ranking within their county. It also includes statewide information on the number of influenza, influenza-like illnesses, and pediatric

#### **Did You Know?**

#### Did you know about the importance of provider e-mail addresses?



DSHS Central Office commonly communicates through e-mails to providers. Incorrect or invalid e-mail addresses prevent providers from receiving valuable vaccine related information such as flu pre-book or return labels for expired vaccines.

When reviewing orders and provider information in ITEAMS, make sure to check the primary and secondary contacts' e-mail addresses. Check for typos, as providers may incidentally end their e-mail with ".co" rather than

".com". Also, e-mail addresses should not exceed 40 characters. E-mail addresses longer than 40 characters will create an error.
