A case is counted if:

- it is reported to DSHS HSR 8
- signs, symptoms and laboratory results meet the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention criteria for a "probable" or confirmed case (Note: for tuberculosis and sexually transmitted diseases, only confirmed cases are counted)
- onset or diagnosis occurred within the reporting period

A case is not counted if:

- investigation or classification is pending
- onset or diagnosis occurred outside the reporting time period

Monthly reports are subject to changes in case counts and classifications. Final counts for 2013 will be published in the DSHS HSR 8 2013 Annual Communicable Disease Report.
