*Monthly reports are provisional as of 08/17/2015 and are subject to changes in case counts and classification. Final data for 2015 will be published in the DSHS HSR 8 2015 Annual Communicable Disease Report.

A case is counted if:

- it is reported to DSHS HSR 8
- signs, symptoms and laboratory results meet the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention criteria for a "probable" or confirmed case (Note: for tuberculosis and sexually transmitted diseases, only confirmed cases are counted)
- onset or diagnosis occurred within the reporting period

A case is not counted if:

- investigation or classification is pending
- onset or diagnosis occurred outside the reporting time period

Conditions for which there were no reports during this period are not listed.
