Examples of Entry Level Jobs in Infection Control

Epidemiologist II

- Oversee the investigation of assigned disease outbreaks; serve as lead of an outbreak investigation team consisting of case investigator(s), data entry specialist(s), and/or administrative assistant(s).
- Review epidemiological datasets and perform quality assurance processes.

Disease Intervention Specialist

- Conduct and facilitate provider training on HIV/STD incidence and prevention activities.
- Establish working relationships with public/private partners in health to ensure a clear plan to address community needs on HIV/STD counseling, testing, and gathering partner information.

Healthcare Safety & Epi Staff Services Officer

- Plan, develop, and implement systems and procedures to promote operational efficiency and quality throughout the Healthcare Safety Unit.
- Handle administrative functions including preparing administrative procedures, monitoring invoice payments, and ensuring participation in safety training.
