The HIV Planning Program supports the implementation of innovative strategies to address HIV in Texas through its collaboration with both internal and external stakeholders and data-informed decision-making processes.

Fellowship Projects

The fellow will work to improve HIV prevention and treatment outcomes for communities most impacted by HIV in Texas. They will collaborate with the Planning Team and Section Data Analysts to identify opportunities for program improvement across the HIV continuum. The fellow will conduct literature reviews to inform the program of current research and practices and highlight gaps in knowledge to address enhancing program outcomes. Additionally, fellow will develop and implement qualitative data collection strategies to guide program improvements and recommend effective strategies to achieve better program results.

Fellowship Deliverables

The fellow will create a summary of epidemiologic and program data, identify relevant research topics based on the summary, conduct a literature review addressing these research topics, and produce a final population-based report that includes recommended strategies to enhance program outcomes.

- Data interpretation skills
