Fellowship Activities/Responsibilities: The fellow will be responsible for various tasks that enhance their skills and support our public health initiatives. Key responsibilities include coordinating the STAHC logistics, which involves meeting coordination, outreach to stakeholders, and securing training materials. They will assist with recruitment of healthcare providers for the OBHP Mass Care Exercise, gaining hands-on experience in procurement and volunteer recruitment for essential services. Additionally, the fellow will participate in community outreach events, helping to raise awareness and educate residents on public health initiatives. This will develop their communication and interpersonal skills as they engage with diverse community members. Throughout these responsibilities, the fellow will use and refine skills in project management, data collection, and analysis. They will gain insights into public health strategies and emergency preparedness frameworks while collaborating with multidisciplinary teams.
