# Overview of LHD Data Sharing



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# Background

- Commissioner Dr. Shuford signed a memo that allows DSHS to share record-level data with LHDs using the current Immunizations contract Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).
- Before July 2024, LHDs could only obtain record-level data for clinics they operated or managed.
- DSHS can only share de-identified summary data with LHDs outside of their immediate jurisdiction.



# Background

## Continued

- DSHS provided the record-level data to LHDs in two phases.
  - The first phase provided data through a secure FTP process by mid-July 2024.
  - The second phase provided data through the State Health Analytical and Reporting Platform (SHARP) by winter 2024.
- Communication and training for accessing data in SHARP will occur once access begins.
  - Training series will occur about a week after access begins.
  - Secure FTP process will discontinue once SHARP is in production.

# Registry Data Use

## Goal

Monitor the efficacy of local and state-wide vaccine initiatives and programs.

Implement and evaluate initiatives to improve immunization coverage rates with an emphasis on children 3 years of age or younger.

Conduct quality improvement assessments of Texas Immunization Registry (ImmTrac2) organizations.

Provide education and outreach activities regarding ImmTrac2.



# Registry Data Use

## Best Practices

- Analyze the data set individually and do not link records from one file to another or to other record-level identifiable data.
- Use the data to perform community-level or organization-level outreach instead of individual-level outreach.
- Release data to the public in compliance with [Health and Safety Code Section 161.008\(g\)](#) to safeguard protected health information and to not facilitate the identification of anyone.

# Data Frequency and Inclusion Criteria

- DSHS will provide data by the second Monday of every month.
- The data will include all vaccines for all age groups for consented clients from years 2018–2024.
- The data will also include the standard infant respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) therapeutics and COVID-19 therapeutics for the disaster-consented clients only.

# Client Data

DSHS will only share consented client immunization records that have had an active consent into ImmTrac2 for the past five years. These include:

- ImmTrac2 Adult (IA): standard immunizations
  - IA with Disaster Consent: both standard and disaster immunizations
- ImmTrac2 Child (IC): standard immunizations
  - IC with Disaster Consent: both standard and disaster immunizations

# Client Data

## Continued

- Disaster Consented (DC): children and adult disaster immunizations
- Pending Adults (PA) with Disaster Consent: disaster immunizations

Monthly data sharing files include only disaster-consented immunizations administered during COVID-19 public health emergency (3/1/2020 – 6/15/2023). Files will not include unconsented client immunizations.

# File Specifications

- The data sharing file will be in CSV format.
- SAS, Python, R, or Notepad++ will work to open the file.
- DSHS will provide a separate data dictionary file to explain the data fields included in the provided data.

# Access to Data

- Local health department users will need to request access through IAMOnline.
  - Partner administrators for the LHDs can also request access for users.
- Partner administrators will be the first level approver for these users.
- Once approved, requests will come to Immunizations Section staff to review and approve or deny.

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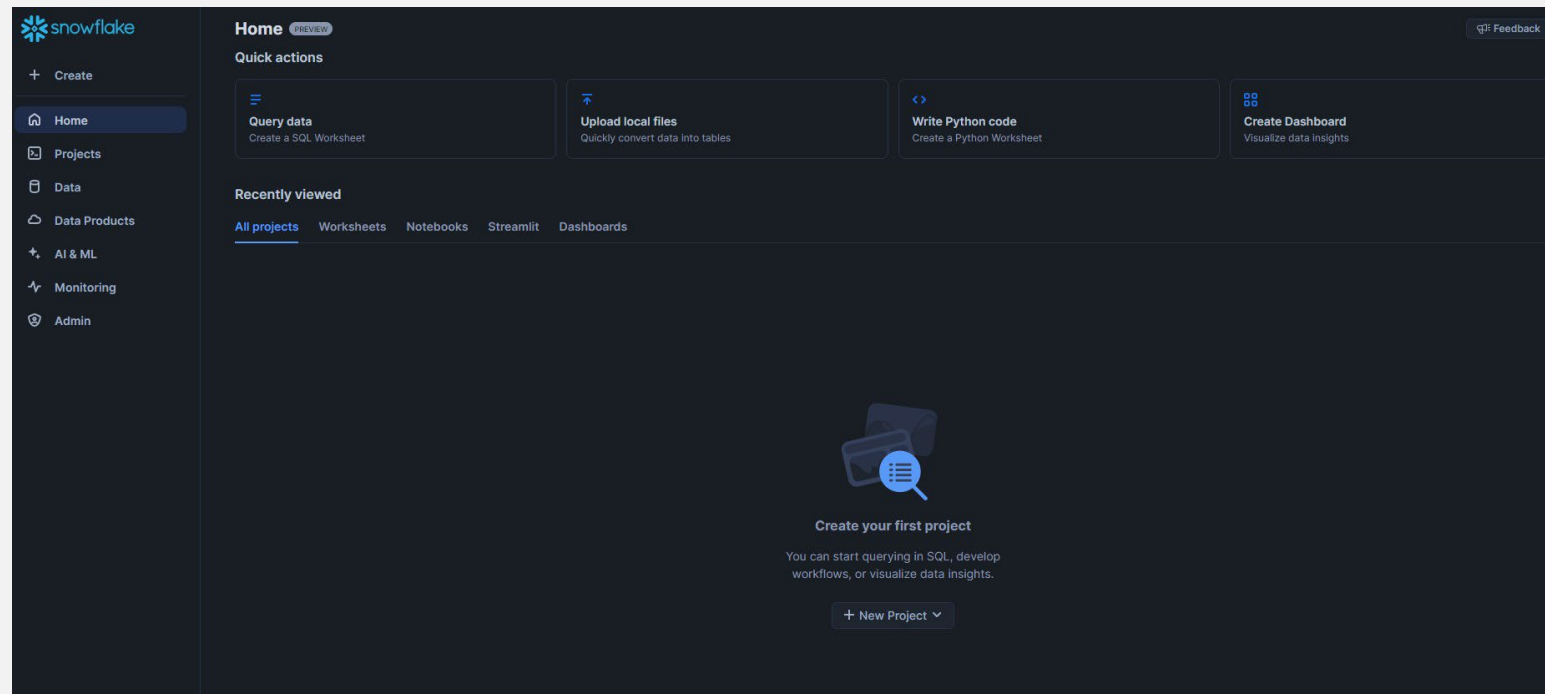

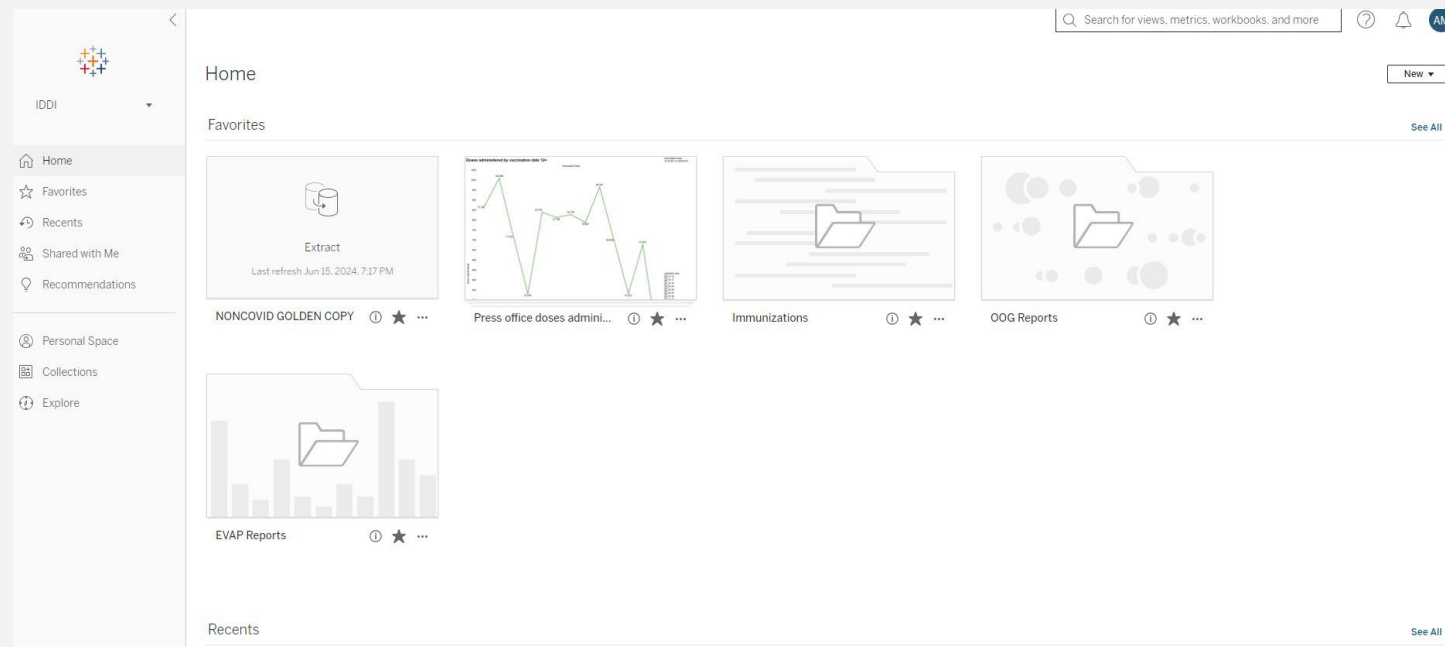

## Part 4

- The CDC expanded the data available on their website including vaccination coverage. VaxView websites have information and interactive dashboards on:
  - Childhood vaccination coverage
  - Kindergarten vaccination coverage
  - Adolescent vaccination coverage
  - Adult vaccination coverage
  - COVID-19 uptake and confidence
  - Flu vaccination coverage
  - RSV vaccination uptake and intent
- Data may only be available for statewide estimates and select counties.
