However, in no case will the individual will be charged more for emergency or other medically necessary care than the amounts generally billed to individuals who have insurance covering such care (¿AGB¿). In determining AGB, the hospital has elected to use the Look-back Method in which the AGB is based on Medicare fee-for-service, as outlined in Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(r), to establish the maximum amount that will be charged to a patient qualifying for financial assistance.
