In furtherance of its charitable mission and values, TCH provides financial assistance to patients and/or their families who are low-income, uninsured or underinsured, ineligible for government health care programs, and who are otherwise unable to pay some or all of the bills related to services deemed medically necessary by Medicare, Medicaid, or industry standards.
