Health System Performance These projects aim to increase capacity of the local health system by training the next generation of health care professionals and by offering needed services: 8) Professional training of residents, medical students, registered nurses, allied health, and others 9) Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner program providing trained, local health professionals to identify and support persons experiencing assault. Other service lines benefitting underserved and at-risk populations These services aim to increase access to health care and implement best practices for women's and children's health, an area of need in NETX particularly for women of color: 10) Obstetrics Emergency Department 11) Labor & Delivery implementing TexasAIM initiative 12) Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Other community benefit activity 13) Grants and In-Kind support for area not-for-profit groups.
