Christus health Ark-La-Tex provides medication assistance for Community residents who are unable to afford the medications they need. The hospitals work with Community pharmacies and other pharmaceuticals companies to identify these patients and distribute the needed medications to them. Collaborative efforts with Genesis Prime care, all for kids' pediatric clinic and Randy Sams homeless shelter provide primary care to meet the needs of the poor, underserve and homeless. Christus Health Ark-la-Tex also supports the needs of special populations in the community by providing health screenings and education for early detection of cancer and heart disease as well as screenings and immunizations for children through a mobile health clinic. Health education programs, screenings and adult immunizations assist other targeted populations such as persons age 65 or older and African Americans.
