

## Emergency Medical Services Personnel 2019



In 2019, there were 65,176 actively licensed emergency medical services (EMS) personnel in Texas.

- This number represented a 7.4% increase since 2014 and a 19.9% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the EMS workforce has improved by 2.0% over the past 10 years.



## Ratio of Texas Population to EMS Personnel by County

- There was a 25.6% difference between the number of EMS personnel in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the difference was 9.4%.
