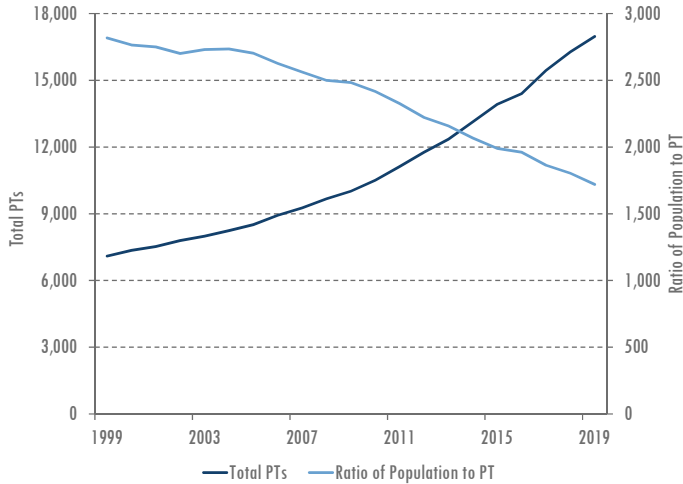




Physical Therapists 2019

PT Growth Trends

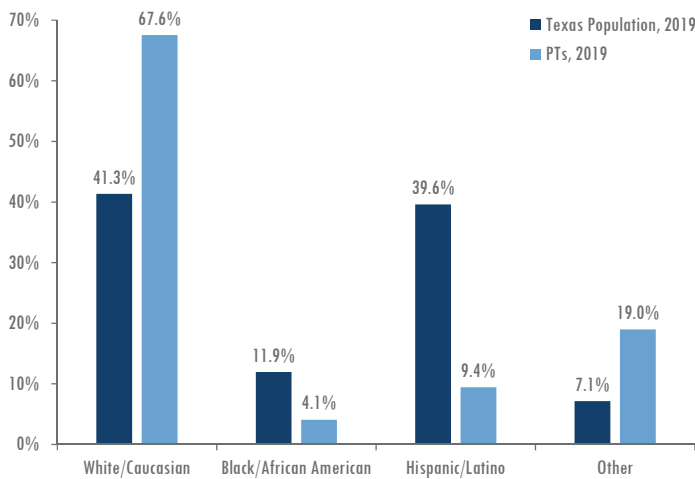


In 2019, there were 16,973 actively licensed physical therapists (PTs) providing care in Texas.

- This number represented a 29.2% increase since 2014 and a 69.5% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the PT workforce has improved by 30.7% over the past 10 years.

Despite these improvements, Texas still had fewer PTs than the national average.

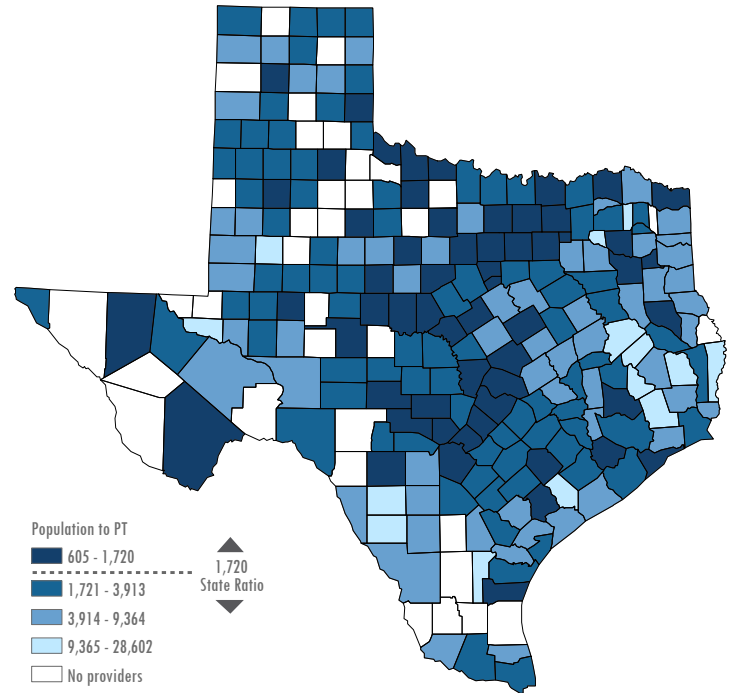
Race/Ethnicity of PTs



The racial/ethnic distribution of Texas PTs differed greatly from that of the Texas population.¹

Ratio of Texas Population to PT by County

PTs were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 50.4% difference between the number of PTs in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the percent difference was 59.1%.

Gender of PTs

- In 2019, 68.6% of PTs were female and 31.4% were male.
- In 2009, 71.2% were female and 28.8% were male.
- Among PTs aged 40 years or younger in 2019, 69.2% were female and 30.8% were male.

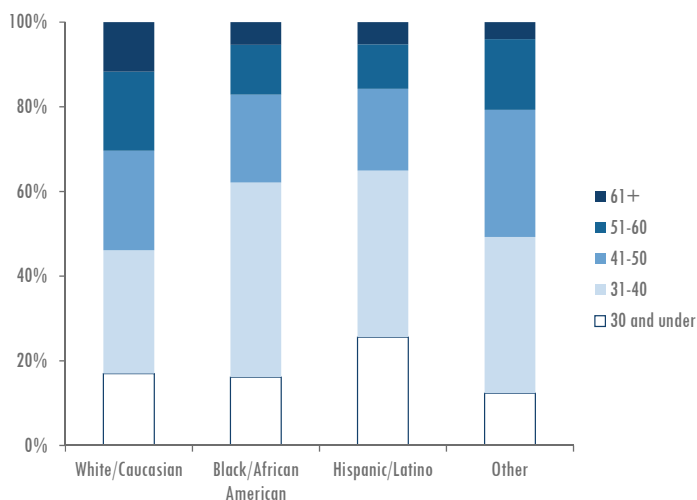

Within 10 years, 26.7% of the current Texas PT workforce will be at or past retirement age.

- 4.0% of active PTs in Texas were older than 65 years of age in 2019.
- 49.1% were 40 years of age or younger.
- Among PTs over 55 years of age, females comprised 71.6% of the PT workforce.

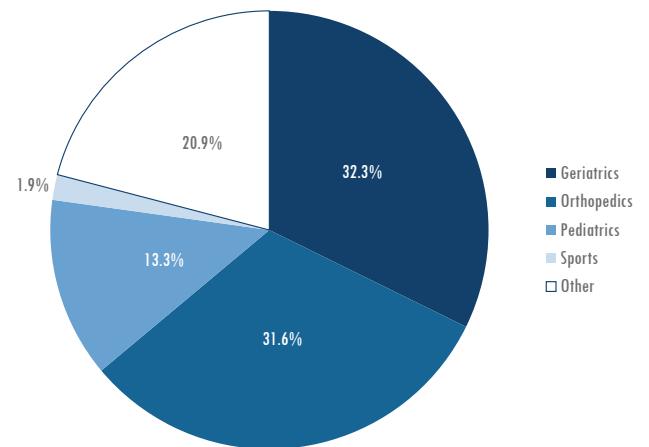
Age Distribution of PTs by Race/Ethnicity



- Among white/Caucasian PTs, 46.1% were aged 40 years or younger. Another 23.5% were between 41 and 50 years of age.
- 62.1% of blacks/African Americans were aged 40 years or younger, while 5.4% were 61 years of age or older.
- 64.9% of Hispanics/Latinos were aged 40 years or younger, while 5.3% were 61 years of age or older.
