
Trends, Distribution, and Demographics

Respiratory Care Practitioners

2019






In 2019, there were 13,723 actively licensed respiratory care practitioners (RCPs) in Texas.

- This number represented a 4.9% increase since 2014 and a 15.6% increase since 2009.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the RCP workforce has declined by 1.5% over the past 10 years.

- 38.2% were between 41 and 55 years of age.
- 38.6% of RCPs were 40 years of age or younger in 2019.
- Within 10 years, 23.1% of RCPs will be eligible for retirement.

RCPs were not evenly distributed throughout the state.

- There was a 36.9% difference between the number of RCPs in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas even after controlling for population differences.
- Between border and non-border areas, the difference was 19.9%.
