

Sex Offender Treatment Provider Growth Trends

This fact sheet is an overview of the trends, distribution, and demographics of sex offender treatment providers (SOTPs) in Texas. In 2020, there were 580 actively licensed SOTPs in Texas.

- This number represented a 8.8% increase since 2015 and a 28.3% increase since 2010.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the SOTP workforce has improved by 8.9% over the past 10 years.

Figure 1. Total SOTPs





Figure 2. Ratio of Population to SOTP

Figure 3. Ratio of Texas Population to SOTP by County



SOTPs were not evenly distributed throughout border and non-border counties, and were more evenly distributed in metropolitan and non-metropolitan counties.

- Per capita, non-metropolitan counties had 1.1 times as many SOTPs as metropolitan counties.
- Per capita, non-border counties had 2.3 times as many SOTPs as border counties.

Demographics of Sex Offender Treatment Providers

Gender of Sex Offender Treatment Providers

- In 2020, 58.0% of SOTPs were female and 42.0% were male.¹

Age Distribution of SOTPs by Gender

Within 10 years, 54.8% of the current Texas SOTP workforce will be over 65 years of age.²

- 32.8% of active SOTPs in Texas were over 65 years of age in 2020.
- Of SOTPs over the age of 55, 51.3% were men.
