

CHW Certification


Total CHWs Certified by Year



Total CHW Certified



CHW APPLICATIONS APPROVED




CHW Instructor Certification

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


- A Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)

Mano A Mano Initiatives

- ANA/Expanding Our Reach connecting migrant families to health care services
- Diabetes prevention program
- □ COVID-19/influenza vaccine outreach
- □ Home visits and community resource referrals



ANA (Ampliando Nuestro Alcance) Expanding Our Reach

- Focuses on the migrant seasonal agricultural worker population
- Facilitates access to care
- Provide education on diabetes and pre-diabetes
- Conduct home visits and home assessments
- Facilitate services when they leave out of state
- Facilitate services upon their return home



Diabetes Prevention Program

- CDC recognized program
- Promotoras are certified as lifestyle coaches
- Identify patients and community members who met criteria to participate in the program
- Year long program consisting of 26 sessions
- Help participants make healthy lifestyle choices
- Incorporate physical activity
- Seen as a support group by participants



COVID19/Influenza Vaccine Outreach

- Group presentations
- Health fairs & community events
- Vaccine clinics
- Warm handoffs



Home Visits & Community Resource Referrals

- Facilitate access to health care
- Home visits/assessments by provider requests
- Act as a liaison between the provider and the patient
- Provide direct support (home visits)
- Referrals to community resources



Benefits of Promotoras at BCHC

- Promotoras are a trusted source in the community
- Break down barriers to health care
- Help improve health care outcomes for patients
- Bring awareness and educate the community on different healthcare topics





2019, Public Health Region 9/10 - CHW Training Needs Assessment






COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER TRAINING NEEDS ASSESSMENT PUBLIC HEALTH REGION 9/10


Demographics

Out of the 313 CHWs who received the link to the survey, 113 submitted an answer. The majority of CHWs are concentrated in El Paso, County. Border rural counties have only four CHWs, two in Hudspeth County and two in Presidio County.



Training Needs

 $650\!\%$ CHWs said that there are not enough training available that offer CEUs. The majority of CHWs obtain their training through their employer.





Completion Rate














Job/Volunteering Functions (1 of 4)


% of Respondent's Working Status

Top Function of CHWs Current Role




Top Function of CHWs Current Role with the Organization They Work/Volunteer

% of Employers Who Require or Do Not Require Certification










Response to skills training availability for CHWIs





Type of Entity Providing Training to CHWs/CHWIs








Preferred Virtual Platform for Training










CHW Confidence Levels Based of Core Competency Skills
