## **Oral Health Improvement Program**

The Oral Health Improvement Program (OHIP) strives to promote oral health through leadership in public health practices, policy development, education, and population-based preventive services.

**2022 – 2023 School Year –** OHIP conducted the Basic Screening Survey and visited 114 schools for BSS, screened 1,930 third graders and screened 2,384 kindergarteners.

July 2023 – OHIP promoted the importance of maintaining optimal oral health during pregnancy through a Smiles for Moms and Babies, digital social media campaign.

**November 2023** – OHIP collaborated with the Office of Border Public Health to publish a *Smiles for Moms and Babies – Online Training Course* (Spanish Edition).

**April 2024** – Over 500 course certificates awarded since the launch of *Smiles for Moms and Babies* – *Online Training Course* in November 2021.

June 2024 – OHIP was awarded the HRSA Maternal and Child Health – Improving Oral Health Integration Demonstration Projects cooperative agreement. This is the launch of Preventive Oral Health Care Integration in Texas (POHCIT).

July 2024 – Published and shared a Live Virtual Training version of the *Smiles for Moms and Babies – Online Training Course* with community health workers, instructors, and the Office of Border Public Health.

**August 2024** – Exhibit at the 2024 Texas WIC Nutrition and Breastfeeding Conference in Austin, Texas.
