

#### Grant Applications and Funding About the GDC Grant Development Center The Grant Development Center (GDC) provides grantsmanship education and health-related funding information for State of Texas residents. The GDC replaces the Funding Information Data Resources Center (1990 to 2022). The GDC is part of the Department of State Health Services Office of Funding Opportunity Databases Practice and Learning GDC Email Updates The Funding Information Center (FIC) was established in January 1990 to serve as a statewide clearinghouse for funding information on HIV/AIDS-related programs. As mandated by the Grantsmanship and Nonprofit 1989 Human Immunodeficiency Virus Services Act (Texas Health and Safety Code, Title 2, Management Resource Chapter 85, Section § 85.013 and § 85.014), the FIC researched and disseminated HIV/AIDSrelated funding information to the Texas public. The Texas Legislature removed Section § Funding Resources 85.013 from the FIC mandate in April 2015. The scope of FIC coverage then expanded to Grant Writing 101 include almost all public health interests and many social service issues.
