It can transform training and education through a range of uses; clinical knowledge and task shifting, workforce development and training, rapid implementation, clinic management, and operation support, and professional development activities.
- The Rural Telementoring Training Center (RTTC) provides free training, tools, and technical assistance to support the implementation and evaluation of new and current telementoring programs for rural health workers.
