Brief Description

The Perinatal and Infant Health and Safety (PIHS) Intern will work to support the continued goals of the Perinatal and Infant Health Public Awareness, Education, and Communication Campaign. This effort will include activities to increase awareness and uptake among parents, infant caregivers, employers, hospitals, and public health partners of breastfeeding support practices as well as protective factors and risk reduction strategies to improve safe infant sleep practices. Learning objectives for this internship include 1) Apply knowledge of program planning and population-based health interventions to practical public health programs, 2) Identify, collect, and analyze data to meet the needs of a public health program, and 3) Use public health communication skills to develop program educational and promotional materials.
