

Storage and Use of Newborn Screening Blood Spots

Newborn screening blood spots that remain after testing have important uses for both the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) and public health research.

What happens to the blood spot card after testing?

DSHS securely stores the blood spot cards for up to two years per Texas law (Health & Safety Code Sec. 33.018(b)-(c)) and can use them during that time.

Uses include:

- Ensuring DSHS newborn screen tests, equipment, and supplies are working.
- Developing new tests for newborn screening.
- Studying diseases that affect public health as allowed by law.

Please read the following statements. What do you want DSHS to do with your baby's blood spot cards after newborn screen testing is complete?

- If you check the 'OK' box <u>AND</u> sign this form:
 - o DSHS will keep your baby's blood spot cards safe and secure for up to 25 years.
 - Researchers can use the blood spot cards to study public health problems like cancer, birth defects, or other diseases. The research may take place outside of DSHS.
 - You can change your mind at any time. Call DSHS 1(888) 963-7111, ext. 7333 for details.
- If you check the 'NO' box <u>OR do not sign OR do not fill out OR</u> do not return this form:
 - Texas law still requires the newborn screening sample to be collected and tested.
 - o DSHS will keep your baby's blood spot cards safe and secure and destroy them within two years.
 - o DSHS will not allow the use of the blood spot cards for public health research outside of DSHS.

Can DSHS release information about me or my child without permission?

If you choose any option on this form, we cannot release any information that identifies you or your child to anyone outside of DSHS without your written permission. There are a few exceptions, as provided by law.

I have already sent this storage and use form. Do I need to send it again?

NO. One form applies to all your baby's newborn screening blood spot cards. DSHS will act upon the latest valid Storage and Use of Newborn Screening Blood Spot Form received.
