

**Texas WIC Lesson Evaluation Results
DH-000-07: CCNE Healthy Children Healthy Smiles**

Client Feedback

Total # of clients who responded to survey: 121

Clients surveyed identified themselves as:

- Pregnant: 17%
- Breastfeeding: 9%
- Caretaker of baby under 12 months: 46%
- Caretaker of a child over 1 year: 57%
- Friend of family: 13%
- First WIC class: 16%

Language in which the class was taught:

- English – 59%
- Spanish – 40%
- Both – 1%

Compared to other WIC classes, clients awarded this class **4.5stars** (out of 5).

Clients rated the class as follows on the items below:

Clients indicated one thing they learned that they would try at home. Out of 102 write-in responses, themes for the comments included:

- Proper oral hygiene such as using the correct amount of toothpaste to use per age child, frequency of brushing and flossing, length of brushing, when to visit the dentist (at what age and how often), wiping down gums or drinking water after baby eats/drinks, not sharing eating utensils, not putting baby to bed with bottle
- The importance of a healthy diet for healthy teeth; able to identify foods that promote and foods that help protect against tooth decay

Staff Feedback

Total # of staff who responded to the survey: 16

Staff surveyed included: CA (6), Nutritionist (4), NE Coordinator (1), Clinic Supervisor (2), Other (3) and had the following degrees: LVN (6), RD (1), Degreed Nutritionist (5), Other (5).

Language in which the class was taught:

- English – 50%
- Spanish – 6%
- Both – 44%

Staff reported the following as working well when teaching the class:

- The visual aid of teeth with cavities really caught the attention of parents
- Using the ice breaker
- Clients' participation
- Use of *Take Time for Teeth* "flipchart"
- Asking the parents if any of them have taken their infant to the dentist for the first visit or if they have other children and remember their first trip to the dentist. After parents raise their hands, I ask them to share the experience with the class. This stimulates conversation among participants every time. Ones that have not yet taken their little one to the dentist for the first visit often ask the other participants questions.
- Clients like the subject of dental health for their babies/children, so most of them are willing to participate in the discussion.

What staff would do differently the next time they teach the class:

- Have food labels for foods mentioned in the lesson and show the amount of sugar (from food label) in each
- More open-ended questions
- All went well maybe spend a little more time interacting with participant
- I might use some dental models in the future
